Epiphany House Blessing Prayer

Epiphany celebrates the joyous truth that God calls into relationship with Himself not only the chosen people of Israel, but the entire world. Families have traditionally "marked" this truth by the practice of "chalking" the front door of their homes at Epiphany. This visible mark on your door reminds your family, friends and guests that you hope they will find Christ in your home, just as did the Magi who followed the star to Bethlehem.

Here's how it works:

Using the chalk blessed at Church, your family writes the numerals for the New Year over or on your front door. In the middle of the numerals, add the initials "CMB." Tradition suggests that this comes from the Latin blessing, Christus mansionen benedicat, "May Christ bless this home." These are also the initials of the three wise men, known to us as Caspar, Melchior, and Balthasar. Both interpretations remind us of God's generous gift of gracing us with his presence.

Here's the ritual to be prayed together as a family. You'll need a Bible and the chalk blessed at Mass. All make the Sign of the Cross. The leader begins:

Leader: Let us praise God, who fills our hearts and homes with peace. Blessed be the name of the Lord.

All: Now and forever.

Leader: After the Lord Jesus was born in Bethlehem, Magi from the east followed a star to Bethlehem where they found the new-born child and worshipped him. Mary and Joseph cared for Jesus and watched over him as he grew. As a man, Jesus preached about God's love for all, He favored the poor, healed the sick, and welcomed the children. He suffered and died for us and God raised him from the dead. He is here with us. Let us make our home a place of welcome and peace where all can see the goodness of Christ. Let us make our home a dwelling place of love. Let us pray: Gracious God, as a shining star once guided the Magi to the birthplace of the infant Jesus, help us who dwell here to be your light in the world. We ask this through Jesus Christ our Lord.

All: Amen.

The Gospel (and additional readings) for Epiphany may now be read by a family member: (Matthew 2:1-12, Isaiah 60:1-6, Psalm 72, or Ephesians 3:2-6).

At the entrance of the home and with hands joined, the leader prays:

Leader: Lord God of heaven and earth, you revealed your only-begotten Son to every nation by the guidance of a star. Bless this house and all who live here. Fill us with the light of Christ, that our concern for others may reflect your love. We ask this through Christ our Lord.

All: Amen.

Family members then chalk the door with the inscription: 20+C+M+B+23

After which the leader concludes by inviting everyone to say the Our Father. Have a Blessed New Year!




Sunday Reflection

Isaiah 60: 1-6; Ephesians 3:2-3a, 5-6; Matthew 2:1-12

Question: "What do you really want from life?" This is something that many people may find difficult to answer. It concerns the deepest longings of our hearts, and the most profound hopes we have for our existence. And it is very good for each of us to ask: "What do I really want?" This great feast of the Epiphany helps us with our response in that it reminds us that what we are always searching for is God, whether we realize it or not. At the same time, this feast affirms that God is always revealing Himself to us. And since God created each of us, and is also our final destiny, it is only natural that it is a basic human desire is to seek Him out. We want to find out where we came from and where we are going: our origin, history and goal. This feast reminds us of something very important in all this: not only did we come from God and will return to Him, but the Son of God came among us to reveal the Good News that we are all God's children, that we are all loved beyond measure, and that we all have the unique opportunity, during this life, to develop and grow as His people. Think of how amazing this is: We desire to find God because He loved us first and gave us life; we can search for Him because He is revealing Himself to us over and over again; and we are given a glimpse of our eternal destiny in the promises of Jesus: words of life, hope, peace and joy. Today as the Church celebrates this momentous feast, let us re-commit ourselves to the search for God: in the sacraments that we receive, in the scriptures that we hear, and in the lives of one another that we share. Let us seek the Lord, who loves us, and wants so much for us to find Him!





Everyday Stewardship

The story of the Wise Men bringing gifts to Jesus, the newborn King, is a great one, isn't it? They had a great big star in the sky to lead the way. I am no Boy Scout, so I am not sure how well I would do following a star like that. But the important point here is that God led them to the manger. The manger was a place that unless God specifically showed you this was where the Christ Child was born you wouldn't have believed it. You would have passed on by.

In our lives, there are no big stars in the sky leading us where we need to go. It isn't so easy sometimes discerning where God is leading us. We may seek to use our gifts wisely, but in what manner and to what end is not always clear.

This is where prayer can make a huge difference. If we seek to cultivate a prayer life where we are mindful of the presence of God throughout our day, then the call is easier to discern. We can help the process by intentionally offering to God in the morning the entirety of the day to come: all our actions, all our time, and all our decisions. In the evening, we can examine the past hours of the day and reflect on when we responded well to Christ's call and when we fell short. Then we resolve to begin again tomorrow, inviting Christ to be with us every step of the way. God may not offer a star in the sky to lead us, but if we invite us on our journey each day, the path will be much clearer.

Catechetical Corner

Q&AWedding Feast & Epiphany

Ouestion:

How are the feasts of the baptism of Jesus and the account of the wedding feast of Cana related to the Epiphany celebration?

Answer:

The Epiphany season focuses on revealing Jesus to the world. Following the Christmas celebration, the liturgical year lays out a series of manifestation points in which Jesus is made publicly known. From its very beginning, the Christian community highlighted three events in the life of Jesus. These are the Epiphany, the Baptism of the Lord and the wedding feast at Cana.

The Epiphany discloses Jesus to the world of the Gentiles, represented by the magi from the East. The accounts of Jesus' baptism reveal his identity and mission, along with exposing him to those to whom he was sent to minister. The miracle of turning water to wine at the wedding feast of Cana, unique to John's Gospel, is the first public sign that Jesus performs, thus manifesting his public identity and his powers.


Today in the Roman Church, these are usually celebrated on three successive Sundays: Epiphany, the Baptism of the Lord which is usually the next Sunday, and the wedding feast of Cana, which is proclaimed on the 2nd Sunday of Ordinary Time in lectionary year C.

These feasts connect around the concept of epiphany, public manifestation of Jesus to the world. They help us get to know more intimately who Jesus is and what he is about. Spend some time delving more deeply into your understanding of who Jesus is. Continue to cultivate these "epiphany" moments in your life. ©LPi



Faith and Fear

When I was little, you could tell I believed in the destructive power of the monsters who lived beneath my bed because I would never let my ankles anywhere near the bottom of the mattress. (It's common knowledge that bare ankles are premium monster bait — ask any child you know).

You can often tell what a person believes by what they fear.

But here's the thing: belief isn't always enough. It's obvious that Herod believed in Christ's power because of how terrified he was by it and by the room he made in his life for the possible impact of the Messiah. In fact, if belief was the only measure of orthodoxy, you could stand most modern Christians next to Herod and he would tower above them.

Remember, there's something just as bad as disobeying God: discounting Him. I know I am guilty of that in a thousand small ways each day. In the person I ignore or the opinion I sneer at. In the unkind words I let roll from my tongue. In the prayers of thanksgiving that I don't say because I am "too busy."

I believe in God, but I do not fear Him - mostly because my very modern understanding of the concept of "fear" would lump God in with those monsters beneath my bed.

But what if we understood fear in a more traditional sense - awe, reverence, and wonder? "All kings shall pay him homage, all nations shall serve him." - Psalm 72:11

When Herod heard the news of the coming of the Messiah, it compelled him to do something. Not the right thing, mind you, but something. It moved him into action.

So, then, it should move us all.






