


Sunday Reflection

Isaiah 8:23-9:3; 1 Corinthians 1:10-13, 17; Matthew 4:12-23

We are in the middle of winter, and some of us are already looking toward the coming of Spring. This is life. Life is filled with anticipation and [we hope] its fulfillment. However, sometimes things do not work out the way we plan; there is great expectancy, and even perhaps some impatience, but then there might be a disappointment, a delay, or even sometimes dashed hopes. But does this really mean that things are a total disaster? No. If we look carefully at our deepest hopes, we can see that God is always ready to respond and fulfill them, even though at the time we may not see it. And what are some of these hopes? Among them are: To have a life of meaning and peace, to be a person of joy and love, and certainly to be happy. The Christian believer understands that a life of selfishness will never give this. Rather, in order to receive these gifts, we must first give ourselves to God and one another by having an intimate relationship with Jesus. Why? Because He alone touches our hearts with perfect love, heals our wounds, and transforms our lives. In today's readings we see anticipation in the Prophet Isaiah, and in the Gospel, we see its fulfillment in Jesus. Isaiah speaks brilliantly of God who brings light to darkness, who is the cause of abundant joy, and who leads people to freedom. Jesus, in our Gospel, proclaims clearly that "the kingdom of God is at hand." All that was foreshadowed, all that was hoped for, all that was anticipated, is now a reality. Jesus is the culmination of everything good thing that was awaited since the beginning of time. He is the ultimate fulfillment of our hopes and dreams. And so, our anticipation is met with an answer from God which is far beyond all our hopes and dreams. This, my friends, is the "Good News" of the Gospel that we Christians are so excited about, even on a cold winter day!







Notes from Honduras

Please think about being a sponsor for an impoverished child at Home of Nazareth School. The story below is about a little girl living in a most difficult situation. An education gives a child opportunities where there are none. Our borders are full of people escaping violence and poverty. Home of Nazareth School is educating the future leaders of Honduras. An education gives HOPE to a child, their family, their parish, and their community. Home of Nazareth School is a beacon of light for so many people suffering from poverty, lack of food, lack of opportunity for work, poor education, etc.

Casie Nicolle is a very special little girl at the Home of Nazareth School. She is being raised by her greatgrandmother. Her father is in a high-security prison and when Casie was three, the father (from prison) ordered the mother to be killed. The great-grandmother took Casie and her little sister into her home along with 5 other people. The grandparents did not take Casie and her sister into their home because they are working (undocumented in the United States). The uncle works construction, but work is sporadic and with the pandemic, he has hardly worked at all. It is his income that supports the family.

The great-grandmother sells mangos to supplement the family income. She came to Home of Nazareth to beg for enrollment for Casie. The little girl was very dirty and covered with lice. The teachers bathed her, got rid of the lice, bought her shoes (she had none), and a school uniform.


Home of Nazareth School staff keep a close watch over Casie; she is 12 now. She has been enrolled at the school for eight years. There are times she still needs personal care and her uniform washed. One time the little girl brought her lunch to school and the only thing inside of the sack was a bug. The family is frequently without food. Casie is kind and very friendly with her classmates. She is a strong little girl and the school told me that she never cries.

Casie is sponsored by a group of friends, The Katie Crew. The sponsors changed Casie's life. She is being nurtured at Home of Nazareth with food, spiritual development, an excellent education, and encouragement. She is a very smart little girl and has the opportunity for a future.

February 18 & 19 we will be collecting donations for food. All of the funds will be used to feed the poorest student families and the poorest people at San Jose Obrero (St. Joseph the Worker) church. We will also have applications available if you wish to sponsor a student.

Nine times out of ten, when the dust is settled, I find that I've said too much and listened too little.


As I've gotten older, the motto I try (not always successfully) to live by is this: You do not have to be on the attack all of the time, even if it's for what you think is the


Care for Creation Conference


Saturday, March 4




