## The Long Walk

The walk down from Mount Tabor after the Transfiguration must have been a long one for Peter, James, and John. How differently they must have viewed the world with the eyes that had seen what they had just seen. How uncertain they must have been.

I think it's important to remember that, on the mountain, they were amazed, yes — but first, they were afraid. We are given the image of these three grown men — these saints, these giants of salvation history — cowering in fear at the voice of God. It was not until Jesus touched them that they could even bear to look up.

Christ was transfigured on Tabor, but in a way, the disciples were transfigured as well. We are all changed by what we see and what we hear. That change can be hard because knowledge is hard. Truth is hard. Sometimes cowering is easier.

Go forth, God told Abram. I will make of you a great nation.

Rise, Christ told his disciples. And do not be afraid.

I spend too much time cowering in fear at the voice of God. I cower even when the voice whispers into my heart instead of booming from the clouds. When it's the start of a hard day or a tough conversation. When it's the middle of a half-finished battle, big or small. When I know where Christ is and what he is asking, but I'm afraid because the walk down the mountain is so long, and the world that awaits me is so uncertain.

- reading a Bible story to your class each day (this is scripted for you)




## Sunday Reflection

Fr Ed Smith

## Genesis 12:1-4a; 2 Timothy 1:8b-10; Matthew 17:1-9

"He was transfigured before them." The account of the Transfiguration of Jesus is read year after year on the Second Sunday of Lent. It is almost as if the Church understands that, as we progress more deeply into the life of quiet prayer, fasting and penance that we are called to during the Lenten season, we need a booster shot of joy, glory, and the miraculous. This certainly occurs for the disciples on the mountain as Jesus is transfigured before their eyes: We are told that "His face shone like the sun and his clothes became white as light." This is certainly amazing, but a question remains concerning why Jesus revealed himself in this way to His disciples. First: Jesus does not become radiant with light on Mount Tabor as just a vulgar display of His divine power. His miracles are never about this. Rather, He shows who He allows them to see a glimpse of His divine glory in order to strengthen the faith of His disciples so that they can see Him as He really is. He is not just a "nice guy" who works miracles and heals the sick. He is, in fact, the Son of God, living among His people, revealing in every action and word the depth of His love and care: that He understands us, and that He calls us to an eternal home in heaven. In the Transfiguration of Jesus, for one moment in time, the veil between heaven and earth is lifted and human beings are witnesses to the glory that is Jesus in His heavenly kingdom. And beholding him forever is the destiny to which we all aspire as Christian believers. The disciples [as well as us] are called to a radical faith in this real Jesus. This is the conviction of faith which can sustain us during the dry times of life, even during the doldrums and penance of Lent. Moreover, it is the assurance of hope in eternal glory that gives us peace even during the most difficult moments of our existence. So, it is a very good thing that we read this Gospel on this Second Sunday of Lent. It reminds us of just who Jesus is, and what He has waiting for us at the end of our journey of life!

This money will be used to feed the poor in the parish of St. Joseph the Worker and students at Home of Nazareth School. Fr. Sevilla purchases beans, rice, tortilla flour, etc. in huge quantities and then his volunteers measure out the food for families and individuals. COVID devastated the already weak economy and people are without employment. In Honduras there are no safety nets to help people with food, shelter, employment etc. Hunger is a horrible problem and people are starving to death.

When Father Sevilla and his volunteers pass out the food, they bags have a small note inside saying this is from the people of St. Margaret of York in Ohio. They care about you, and they are praying for you.

Thank you to those who gave feedback for our parish mission. We wanted to share a snapshot of the results from this survey.

Of those who took the survey 88% attended the event in person and 80% rated the quality of the mission talks as extremely useful. The talk on prayer with a guided prayer exercise was overwhelmingly the favorite of the three talks.


In regards to the schedule, 38% preferred the weekend schedule, 19% preferred the weekday consecutive night schedule we've done in the past and 44% had no preference either way.


