Question & Answers

Coming Back to Church

Ouestion:

Why do we use incense at Mass?

Answer:

The use of incense in religious ceremonies and worship is a practice that predates Christianity, and which is also found in many other religious traditions today.

Incense, which is made from resin infused with aromatic spices and oils, is one of those fundamentally human symbols that incorporates more than one of our senses, helping us to reflect on realities that transcend the everyday details of our lives.

The use of incense in the Church's liturgy — in the Mass, as well as in devotions to the Eucharist and the Liturgy of the Hours — is inspired by the use of incense in the Jewish tradition. In the writings of the Old Testament, we hear about incense being used in the worship of the temple, and Psalm 141 asks, "Let my prayer be incense before you; my uplifted hands an evening offering" (vs. 2). The image here is that, as the incense gently rises to heaven, our prayers also rise to God as something sweet and pleasant.

Another ancient use of incense that has also become part of our Catholic tradition is the idea that when we incense something, it's because it is something special or sacred. This is why the Book of the Gospel is incensed during the Liturgy of the Word and the bread, wine, priest celebrant, and congregation are incensed at the presentation of the gifts. To this, we can also add the incensing of the Blessed Sacrament during eucharistic adoration and benediction, and the body of the deceased at the end of the Mass of the Resurrection (the Funeral Mass).

Everyday Stewardship

Over the years I have wasted a lot: a lot of money, a lot of time, and a lot of talent. Sometimes I didn't realize I was wasting these things but, after reflection, I realized I could have done more and accomplished much greater things. Of course, I think that is part of our imperfect humanity. It truly is easier for us to waste our gifts than grow them into something more.

The parable of the sower speaks about the word of God that gets planted in our hearts. If the soil of our heart is rich, than the word will grow and change us. If that soil is rocky or full of weeds, the word will lie there without any impact, bearing no fruit.

This parable can be applied to living a stewardship way of life as well. As sowers, we have been given the seeds of our time, talent, and treasure. We have a choice of where to plant these gifts. As good everyday stewards, we are called to plant them wisely and prudently. Oftentimes it is not enough to simply give away what we have. We need to discern the best places to sow these gifts so the maximum harvest can grow. This takes prayer, reflection, and study. Without a solid discernment process, we can find ourselves sowing seeds endlessly without much to show for it. But joyful is the person who has used one's gifts wisely, for the bounty of the harvest is great..


Sunday Reflection

Fr. Ed Smith

Isaiah 55:10-11: Romans 8:18-23: Matthew 13:1-23

The 13th chapter of St. Matthew's Gospel is filled with parables, and so maybe we should begin by asking a question: What is a parable? Is it just a story or fable like Aesop's with a nice moral at the end? Or is it something more? Indeed, it is. The parables of Jesus are not meant to give us some easy answer to life's questions and conclude with something easy like: "The moral of this story is: always be nice," but rather they are to make us think, pray, grow and respond. So, with that in mind, let's look at today's parable. A Sower's seed is thrown in four places: a footpath, on rocky ground, among thorns, and then on some on rich soil. Even those of us who do not have a 'green thumb' realize that planting seeds on a footpath, around rocks, or among thorns is asking for trouble. Jesus uses this image, letting us know that WE are the soil that receives His message. And He wants us to consider: what kind of soil are we, and how do we respond to His Word [the seed]? Do we let other things take it away, so it never even has a chance to grow [footpath]? Do we embrace it, but then find that it is easily lost because we have no roots [rocky ground]? Do we receive it with joy, but find that the message gets easily strangled by anger or anxiety or sin [thorns]? Or...are we good soil, and listen to the Word of Jesus, let it take root, allow it to grow deeper within us, and then bear fruit in a life of love and service? These are good questions, although not the easiest to answer. Jesus knows this, and therefore uses the image of the seed and the soil to help us stop, reflect, pray, and then work on this important aspect of our life. The seed is the Word and message of Jesus. He calls us to love God, to one another, to trust in His teaching, to be people of hope, and to be united as His brothers and sisters. For this to happen, we have to be humble which, interestingly, comes from a Latin root word for 'ground' or 'soil']. We also must make time for prayer, engage in loving service, and accept God's plan for us. Jesus wants only the best for us. Are we ready to listen to His parable? Receive it with joy? And make ourselves the best 'soil' possible for it to take root and grow? It's a great life if we do!

The Archdiocese of Cincinnati, in keeping with its policies, has completed the five-year revision of the Decree on Child Protection. Each user with a SafeParish account will need to download, acknowledge to have read, and agree to abide by the requirements of the revised Decree. If this is not completed within 30 days of the promulgation of the Decree by the Archbishop, the user's SafeParish account will show as pending until the user completes the acknowledgement. Users with pending SafeParish accounts are not permitted to work or volunteer with youth until they have met all the child protection requirements and their SafeParish account is approved. 


