How many public self-storage facilities can you find in your city or town? They seem to be popping up everywhere. One day I was talking to my neighbor and he was explaining that he just wanted to have his garage back again. He was thinking about moving everything to a storage unit so he could gain what he wanted more than all that stuff: space. We talked about the fact that if he chose to follow through with it there was no shortage of places to house all of it. Of course, we also agreed that it would be better to simply let go of all it. He could sell it or give it away. But, of course, it was good stuff! So good, in fact, one was tempted to rent a whole new space to house it!

I am not against stuff in principle, but I do realize that stuff can become a stumbling block to real freedom. Sometimes our possessions take on an importance that begins to dictate how we act or how we give of ourselves to God and others. An everyday steward seeks detachment from things of this world that will one day pass away. Things that we possess should be seen as pathways into experiences that glorify God, whether they allow us to serve others, enrich our lives lived daily for God, or even help make leisure and recreation time resting in God's presence easier. But the simpler the life, the fewer distractions there are from focusing on those we love and our relationship with God. And besides, do you really think a monthly payment to house stuff you don't really need is the best stewardship way of life?


Sunday Reflection

Fr. Ed Smith

Jeremiah 20:7-9; Romans 12:1-2; Matthew 16:21-27

Wouldn't it be nice if we all knew exactly what we must do to be a faithful disciple? This thought seems to have been in the minds of Christians from the earliest days of the Church. Some writers spent years exploring it and the result has been so complicated that few, if any, really understand what the writer is saying. So, when asking this question, it is best to go back to the source: Jesus. What does **He** say about being His disciple? He boils it down to three basic commands: "Deny yourself, take up your cross, and follow me". This is clear, concise, and memorable. However, there is still another question: How do we put these commands into practice? Let's look at some possible answers. First: we deny making ourselves the center of the universe; then we can grow in humility so that God can touch our hearts and make us vessels of His love. Second: we take up our cross, willing to accept what God has given us in life, learning from our suffering and loss, and becoming stronger in our faith through what we have accepted. Third: we follow Jesus, which means we do not set our own agenda and expect Him to change for us, but rather that we trust in His wisdom and love enough that we will go where He leads us, even when we don't understand it completely. And so, this clear, concise and memorable statement from Jesus involves a lot of reflection, because it comes down to living out our vocation as Christians who believe, trust and act as people of faith. In this way, we will be following the commands of Christ, and experience a life of joy and hope. Once again, Jesus shows us that He is a superb teacher, and gives us a greater lesson than we ever requested!



Question & Answers

What Are "Special" Masses?

Ouestion:

What does the Church say about suicide? **Answer:**

Unfortunately, despite the Church's clear teachings in resources like the Catechism of the Catholic Church and the United States Catholic Catechism for Adults, there are still many people who are confused about what the Church teaches regarding the tragic reality of suicide.

While we hold that all life is sacred, we are also all-too aware that psychological, emotional and even physical illness — as well as extreme anxiety, fear, and abuse — can lead individuals to take their own lives. Speaking to this, the United States Catholic Catechism for Adults reflects, "Although suicide is always objectively sinful, one should not despair of the eternal salvation of persons who have taken their own lives. By ways known to him alone, God can provide the opportunity for salutary repentance. The Church prays for persons who have taken their own lives" (pg. 294). The text also states the reality of illness or other extreme influences can "diminish the responsibility of one committing suicide" (pg. 293).

Parishes and grief support groups should show special care and concern for those families that have lost a loved one to suicide. And, communities should always try to be mindful of those who might be at risk of suicide or self-harm.

Baptism Prep Classes

All sacraments require preparation. Baptism Prep Class is for expectant parents who want to have their child baptized. (If your child is already here, congrats. We will still help you prepare for their Baptism with this class.) Once you have completed the paperwork from the class, you will be able to set the date for your child's Baptism. Baptism prep is required for additional children if it's been 4 or more years since your last class or there is a change in pastor. Contact: baptism@smoy.org to sign up for a class. Please provide your phone number when signing up. You can register for the class anytime during your pregnancy. Baptisms prep will not be held in January and July.



As we focus on praying as a family, this month, we look at the Lord's Prayer, better known to Catholics as the "Our Father". This prayer comes to us directly from Jesus when He was asked by His disciples "Lord, teach us to pray." We find two versions of the prayer in the Bible in Luke 11:2-4 and Matthew 6:9-13. The form we pray in the Catholic Church is closest to the prayer in Matthew's Gospel. The "Our Father" is part of Jesus' great Sermon on the Mount, where He taught the Beatitudes and many parables. Let's break down the meaning of this divinely inspired prayer.

Our Father, Who art in heaven

God is our heavenly Father and is all-knowing and all-powerful. Calling God 'our father' reminds us that God doesn't save us as individuals, but as a people, and we are all brothers and sisters in His family. We are reminded to treat everyone as a child of God.

Hallowed be Thy Name

Hallowed means holy and we recognize not only God Himself as holy, but also recognize His name as holy and powerful. When we call on the name of God, we are calling on all power in heaven and on earth, and that's why He asks us not to take His name in vain. We offend God when we use His name in anger or to curse others because it is so holy.

Thy Kingdom come

Here we ask for the Kingdom of God to be a part of our everyday life, our family, our work, our leisure time....everything. As we live each day in the Kingdom of God, we also wait with great hope for the return of Jesus at the end of time.

Thy will be done, on earth as it is in Heaven

We want to conform our will to God's will and do what is pleasing to our Father, just as we are called to obedience to and to honor our earthly parents. We are asked to do God's will even when it's hard, like giving up an extra half hour of sleep to have time to pray every day, or checking in on an elderly neighbor after work, when we are tired from the day.

Give us this day our daily bread

Everything comes from God, and by asking Him to sustain us daily, we acknowledge that. Even more, it's implied for us not to be anxious about tomorrow. We can count on our Father to provide for our daily needs not just physically, but spiritually through the Bread of Life, the Eucharist.

And forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us

For most of us, it is easy to ask God to forgive us our trespasses or sins, but God says we must also forgive those who have hurt us. We can ask God to be merciful and forgive our sins but if we're holding a grudge or refuse to forgive someone who has hurt us, He will only forgive us in the way we forgive others. If you can't forgive someone, ask God to give you the strength to do it.

And lead us not into temptation,

Temptation and sin are closely related. We need God's grace and help to resist the little temptations that come along daily and the big temptations that come along when we are at our weakest. But why would God lead us into temptation as the prayer seems to say? As with all evil, God is not the source of it. He is not the source of temptations, but He allows evil and temptation since He created us with free will. God always brings good out of evil, so temptations and overcoming them can bring us to holiness.

But deliver us from evil.

We have a spiritual enemy, the devil, and evil is a reality in our world. The devil is intelligent and works to find ways to try to steer us from the right path to the wrong one. The devil's goal is to keep us from being holy and living with God forever in Heaven. But, we can rejoice that God is more powerful and Jesus has already won the battle over death, and we have a God who can protect us from the devil.

- Pray it in the car as you head to soccer, school, or gymnastics.
- Teach it in short segments:
 - Parent: Our Father who art in _____
 - Child: Heaven
 - Parent: Hallowed be thy _____
 - Child: Name
 - Sit in a circle and pray one line and then pass it on to the next person.





Choosing the Cross

I've been called a lot of things in my life, but I've never been called "Satan," at least not to my face.

It seems to me the worst name you could call a person, and today we hear it straight from the lips of Jesus. It's just one of the many small reminders strewn throughout Scripture that Jesus preaches meekness, but he is not mild - not when mildness serves no purpose, anyway.

And here, when Peter is trying to deter Jesus from making the right choice, mildness serves no purpose at all.

Can we blame Peter? I certainly can't. I'm sure I would have said the same thing to my own dear friend. He is, in today's Gospel, wholly unwilling to embrace the cross - he's afraid of it, even - but aren't we all, in the end, afraid of our cross? I am. It's no sin, it's only human. Fear is natural. Selfpreservation is a reflex.

What Christ speaks of today is a choice, one we are all faced with, again and again, just as Peter is. We will not always respond perfectly; Peter does not respond well today. He does not respond well on Holy Thursday.


But on his last day, on the day of the ultimate choice? On that day, he chooses the cross.

We marvel at first responders who put themselves in harm's way for the sake of others, because to do so is not human, it is divine. I have to believe that if even a firefighter's loved one threw themselves in his way, he would still charge toward the flames, crying, "Get behind me."

Christ runs into the burning building for us, shaking off not only his own fear (and he had it, I promise you — he was human, too) but the fear of everyone who loved him.


