Financial Support Needed for St. Vincent de Paul

Our St. Vincent de Paul (SVdP) Ministry here at SMOY helps our local neighbors in need by paying their rent, utility, food and other bills. We are 100% funded by the generous support received from our parishioners, largely from the Fifth Sunday envelopes four times a year. We receive NO funding from the parish or other entities. This past year, we have been able to help our clients with over \$42,000 of support for their bills, with 84% of that amount going to pay rent and utilities, with the balance for food and other needs.

Our current bank balance has reached alarmingly low levels, such that future assistance to meet our neighbor's need is in jeopardy, and our support to them may soon be curtailed or worse yet eliminated.

We are currently seeing higher and more frequent requests for both rental and utilities, as both rates continue to skyrocket in our area.

We are hoping that our current situation is temporary. Please consider a financial donation to help us keep our SMOY SVdP ministry alive and well. Thank You.

Sunday Reflection

Fr. Ed Smith

Ezekiel 33:7-9; Romans 13:8-10; Matthew 18:15-20

Where were you when you first heard about the attacks of September 11, 2001? Most of us have vivid memories of this moment: shock, disbelief, fear, confusion, and vulnerability might have been part of what we felt at the time. I remember that, as soon as I heard what happened, I called my classmate, Fr. Bob, a priest in New Jersey, who could see the twin towers from his parish. I wanted to see how he was and what he might know about the situation. He answered the phone without a "hello" but instead said: "I am okay. Don't worry. I know God is taking care of us." This was from someone who lived close to the skyline of New York, and who had people in his parish who knew people who lost their lives in that terrorist attack. It was a good thing for me to hear that morning, when I wondered what was happening in our world. To be able to continue to trust in God's presence, love and watchfulness is not always easy. Sometimes it calls for great strength of will and tremendous faith. But, even in the worst of times, we know that God is here with us, and as Jesus reminds us in the Gospel: "Where two or three are gathered together in my name, there am I in the midst of them." Among the many strong memories I have from 22 years ago, I recall the intensity of the liturgies of the Sunday following September 11: packed churches, people supporting each other, Christians praying with and for one another. Even out of such a terrible moment in our nation's history, God brought together so many of us to show solidarity, hope and a commitment to follow the refrain of our Psalm: "Harden not your hearts", but rather come into God's presence with thanksgiving for our faith, families, and the love that binds us together. As Fr. Bob reminded me that terrible morning of 9/11: "Don't worry. God is taking care of us."

Our Parish's Strengths

The results of the survey were overwhelmingly positive. Here are few of the key highlights of our strong points.

88%	of respondents believe the Church is critical to their relationship with God. 59% of these strongly believe the Church is critical to their relationship with God.



Question & Answers

Should a Catholic Pursue an Annulment?

Question:

After a civil divorce, is a Catholic obligated to pursue an annulment? Answer:

Many Catholics are not exactly sure what an annulment does. An annulment does not deny that a marriage took place, nor does it deny that there once was love. It does not mean that people say anything untrue, such as they never loved each other or that everything in their marriage was wrong. An annulment does not negate children, nor make them illegitimate. An annulment addresses the spiritual aspect of marriage. In effect, an annulment says that at the time of the wedding, there was either something present or something absent that prevented the sacrament from taking place. It is a spiritual determination that, if granted in the affirmative, allows a person to marry in the Church.

Annulments have no legal standing and are unable to be used in a civil court. Therefore, a Catholic has no moral obligation to pursue an annulment. However, when the tragedy of divorce occurs, and there is no hope for reconciliation, annulments may help bring some spiritual closure to a person's life. Some people have found the process to be healing and others have found it to be difficult. Speak to your priest or a member of the Diocesan Tribunal staff to decide what is best for you.

Love and Truth

I think even the most devout, the most pious Catholic reading this could summon to mind, if asked, one or even two examples of Catholic teaching for which they have desperately looked for a loophole.

Don't worry, I won't make you share with the group. But bring it to your mind now: the doctrine you once resented, or perhaps still do. The commandment you don't fully understand, the one you bristle against. The rule you find the hardest to follow. The belief you hate explaining to your friends.

If it disappeared from scripture or dropped out of the catechism, would your life really be easier? Would you be happier?

I am thinking of mine. For a long time, I searched high and low for a way around this particular teaching. I read books and Scripture and tradition, I prayed and reflected and tried to argue with myself. For a time, I gave up complying with it entirely. I threw it to the wind, with a shoulder shrug and a self-satisfied assurance to myself that God, being a loving father, does not want his child to be unhappy.

But reader: I was miserable. I was so, so miserable, and I stayed that way until I finally accepted that God is, indeed, a loving father, and desires nothing less than the unhappiness of his children. And so, to ward it off, he has given us the truth, and asked us to share it amongst ourselves like a cherished heirloom, a priceless inheritance.

To share truth, you must show love. To show love, you must share truth. One demands the other. Because this is what Christ does for us, and this is the mission of the Church in this world. Loosening and binding. Bearing witness. Giving testimony. Speaking truth, and in speaking truth, showing love.


Caregiver Mass at Cathedral Basilica of St. Peter in Chains




