# Sunday Reflection

Fr. Ed Smith

Isaiah 25:6-10a; Philippians 4:12-14, 19-20; Matthew 22:1-14

For those of us who really enjoy our food, today's readings are a veritable feast! The Prophet Isaiah tells us that the Lord will provide rich food and choice wine for all peoples. St. Paul speaks of being well fed and living in abundance. Even the Responsorial Psalm reminds us that God has "spread a table before me in the sight of my foes." Then we come to the Gospel, where this theme goes even further. Jesus, once again the master story-teller, proclaims a parable about a king planning a wedding feast. Many are invited, but so many of the invited guests don't come that the king ends up bringing in anyone who will show up. In this way he fills up the banquet hall. However, one guest, pulled in off the street, is not dressed properly for the wedding; and when the king asks why the man has not exerted even the minimum effort to be presentable at the celebration, the man is silent. So, the king has the man ejected from the feast. At first, this seems cruel; the man did show up after all, but then it appears he was tossed out because of a technicality. But we must remember that this is a parable. And a parable is meant to tease us and make us think. What Jesus wants us to know is that the 'garment' the man wears is a symbol for our lives here on earth. We are all invited to be members of the kingdom, but we are also called to live as God's children, clothed in goodness and love. The man at the feast is thrown out because he refuses the responsibility of this life of faith. Perhaps it is good for all of us to ask what 'garment' we are wearing these days, and reflect on the many opportunities we have to share in the banquet of Christ's sacrifice at the Eucharist, and be nourished with the Bread of Life, the Word of God, and the community of faith that is the Church!



#### The Invitation to the Vineyard

I have been working since I was 17, and in that time, I've encountered my fair share of bosses who don't like being, well, fair.

There was the retail gig that paid me less than the official minimum wage because I was a minor and scheduled me for long shifts because it meant cheaper labor. There was the restaurant manager who tried to convince me to leave seventh period early so I could waitress on a busy dinner shift (totally illegal, by the way). There was the unpaid internship with the editor who had no sense of work/life balance.

Our resumes are all full of these experiences - it's capitalism, after all. It conditions us to look out for ourselves, because we know no one else will. And it breeds an attitude of suspicion that often blooms into jealousy when we encounter the reckless mercy of God.

Most of us work hard for what we have in this life, and so we make the mistake of thinking we deserve the good things that come our way. That's all right and good when we're talking about a just wage. But sometimes we get our lines blurred and we begin to think we deserve, or have done something to earn, the salvation offered by Christ.

I am not the laborer who has borne the heat of long hours in the sun. I am the straggler, the lost one, the idler at the marketplace as the day draws to a close.

# Question & Answers

#### **Priests & Marriage Counseling**

#### **Ouestion:**

How can a priest counsel people about marriage when he has never been married?

#### **Answer:**

If a marriage counselor is in a bad marriage does that mean that he or she will be a bad counselor? If one's counseling ability depended upon firsthand experience, would that require counselors to be perfect before they can help others? Obviously not. Some of the skills necessary to help others do come out of personal life experience. But you don't need personal, first-hand experience in order to understand something. We would not think that a doctor, who is an oncologist, would not be able to treat cancer because he himself has never been sick. We also would not expect every doctor to treat cancer. It is the same with priests.

Essentially marriage is a relationship and we've all been involved in different kinds of relationships: in our family, with our friends, and with God. And so counseling people about marriage is really helping them to look at the issues that really are part of their relationship, finding ways to better understand themselves in relationship to one another and in relationship to God. In many ways a priest's training, background, and experience, as well as his personal knowledge of many different relationships in families and couples, gives him a broad background from which to draw upon. Most priests are quite capable of helping couples prepare for marriage and discussing the issues that are important as they begin their life together. And they do not do it alone. With the help of married couples and specially trained counselors, most parishes offer a very good preparation for the sacrament of marriage...


# Everyday Stewardship

#### Be Sure to Look the Part

I used to coach my oldest son in soccer when he was younger. As he got older, he would go to tryouts for select and high school teams. I was no longer the coach, but I always shared with him one piece of advice before any tryout: Be sure to look the part. I told him that if he showed up looking like a soccer player, there was an increased chance of him being seen as a soccer player. If he showed up looking like a kid that plays soccer in video games as opposed to the real thing, he might not be taken seriously. As he grew older, that same advice was then applied to getting a job. It's advice I have heeded myself all my life. You can even say it is like another common phrase: "Fake it till you make it."

As disciples of Jesus Christ, we certainly do not want to fake it, but we do need to look the part. The world looks at those of us who proclaim to be Christians to see if there is anything to this way of life. If they see us looking and acting like people transformed by Jesus Christ, they will be more likely to take Christianity seriously. If they look at us and see nothing different, then they can easily conclude that there is nothing different about Jesus Christ. He just becomes simply another religious figure of history. Can the world see the power of Christ in you? How will do you look the part?




