Sunday Reflection

Fr. Ed Smith

Malachi 1:14b-2:2b, 8-10; 1 Thessalonians 2:7b-9, 13; Matthew 23:1-12

As a former Latin teacher, I enjoy peppering my conversation with a phrase or two in that 'dead' language if possible, and one of my favorites is: "esse guam videri" which means: "to be rather than to seem". It means that it is a virtue to be who we really are instead of pretending to be someone we are not. This is a great way to live and is one of the powerful lessons in today's Gospel. Jesus, who is compassionate and caring, has little patience for hypocrisy. Those who try to appear to be something they aren't, or those who say they are doing something but do not do it are spoken of in the strongest terms by Our Lord. Why is He so adamant about this? Probably because when we pretend to be something other than we are, someone is going to suffer, either ourselves or others. We are certainly aware of the truth, and it takes a lot of energy and lying to keep up the appearance of something different than we truly are; also, if we pretend around others, it is dishonest, and shows that we do not respect their right to know the truth. It can also make us unhappy with ourselves, since we conjure up a false identity or personality that we think others will like better. Sadly, this is done by many people on the internet. In the end, it shows a lack of faith. If we really have faith that God made us as we are, then we should be grateful for the gift of how God made us and not try to 'improve' on it. When Jesus condemns the scribes and the Pharisees it is not done because He dislikes them, but rather so they might begin to see how they have settled for something less in their lives. God's love for them and the life they have been given is so much better than any earthly laws they can make up. So perhaps this week might be a good time for us to look at who we truly are, thank God for making us the way we are, and examine how we might grow so that we can serve Him better by being the persons he wants us to be. This is the way to a good life; this is the way to happiness, and as our psalm reminds us this weekend, this is the way to peace.



When you hear the word angel, does a chubby-faced little cherub come to mind or maybe a misty transparent image with feathery wings? No matter what your imagination pictures, the fact is that angels exist. The Catechism tells us in CCC 328 "The existence of the spiritual, non-corporeal beings that Sacred Scripture usually calls "angels" is a truth of faith." We even celebrate angels in our Liturgical calendar on Sept 29 - Feast of Saints Michael, Gabriel, and Raphael, Archangels, and Oct 2 - Memorial of the Holy Guardian Angels.

In CCC 329 St. Augustine says: "Angel' is the name of their office, not of their nature. If you seek the name of their nature, it is 'spirit'; if you seek the name of their office, it is 'angel': from what they are, 'spirit', from what they do, 'angel.' Angels are servants and messengers of God, that's their office or position. They are pure spirits with no physical bodies. They can take on a physical appearance when necessary so that we can see them with our eyes.

Furthermore, in CCC 330 we read that "As purely spiritual creatures angels have intelligence and a will." They are personal and immortal creatures that don't get sick, don't die, and aren't constrained by space and time. Angels are more perfect than human beings because, by their very nature, they are more like God. God is pure intellect and will, unlike human beings who also have a body.

The angels were all created at the beginning of time, so that means that our loved ones who have died and gone to Heaven, do not turn into angels. They were created out of God's love, just as He created us out of love and all angels were created good. The fallen angels

were also created good - God cannot create anything evil. They however used their intellect and their will to refuse to do what God asked of them. Satan was once an angel but by his free will, he refused to do God's will and became evil. He was kicked out of heaven and can never repent and return there. But why? The superior knowledge of angels let them know that Jesus would be born as a man, and Satan and the fallen angels did not wish to serve a creature lower than themselves. The sin of pride led them to refuse to serve man and the sin of envy makes them wish for no good to come to human beings.

There are many references to angels in sacred scripture, these are just a few of the ways they appeared:

- Guarded the Garden of Eden
- Kept Abraham from sacrificing Isaac
- Assisted Tobin
- Assisted the prophets
- Announced the birth of Jesus
- Protected Jesus in Infancy
- · Ministered to Jesus in the desert and Garden of Gethsemane

We invoke angels in the Mass at the Preface and in our Funeral liturgy, in fact, whenever we celebrate Mass, we are celebrating with the saints and all the angels in heaven.

Preface - And so, with Angels and Archangels, with Thrones and Dominions, and with all the hosts and Powers of heaven, we sing the hymn of your glory, as without end we acclaim:

Funeral Liturgy - May the angels come to greet you, may they take you to Paradise.

Each human life from birth, until they get to heaven, has a Guardian Angel. We receive our Guardian Angel at our conception, but the angel was created at the start of creation, so our Guardian Angel waited for us to be conceived. Each Guardian angel has a name, but we don't name them, because we could be wrong about their name and God has already named them.

CCC 336 From its beginning until death, human life is surrounded by their watchful care and intercession. "Beside each believer stands an angel as protector and shepherd leading him to life." Already here on earth the Christian life shares by faith in the blessed company of angels and men united in God.

The job of our Guardian Angel is to:

- Ward off dangers for both body and soul
- Help to distribute God's grace to us
- Remove temptations
- Prevent Satan's suggestions of sin
- Foster holy thoughts and desires
- Offer our prayers to God and pray for us
- Correct us if we sin
- · Help us at our death
- · Conduct us to heaven or if to purgatory, then console us there

If you haven't talked to your Guardian Angel before, give it a try. Invite your angel into your time of prayer and ask for help if you are feeling tempted. Teach your family to call on their Guardian Angel when frightened or troubled or tempted. The classic Catholic Guardian Angel prayer is:

Angel of God, my quardian dear, to whom God's love commits me here, Ever this day, be at my side, to light and guard, to rule and guide. Amen.

Question & Answers

Sin on the Soul

Question:

Why do some sacraments leave a character or mark on the soul? Don't all sacraments affect the soul?

Answer:

All sacraments mediate grace and connect us to Christ and to the Church. Some sustain us in our faith journey, while others help us heal from the effects of sin. Each one offers a share in God's life, giving us what we need to be faithful followers of Jesus. But some sacraments change us in ways that are irreversible. The three sacraments that leave a character are Baptism, Confirmation, and Holy Orders. We are literally different people because of the effect of the grace of those sacraments. We are changed at the core of our being in such a fundamental way that we can not go back to what we once were.

In Baptism, we are freed from original sin, initiated into the Body of Christ as adopted sons and daughters. In Confirmation, we are given the fullness of God's Spirit, sealed in his grace and gifted with what we need to live a Christian life. In Holy Orders, a priest is marked as an 'alter Christus,' another Christ, and is once and forever a priest who offers sacrifice, forgives sin, and acts in the person of Christ. In these three sacraments, we are conformed more closely to Christ, reflecting his love and truth.

A Heavy Burden, Hard to Carry

"Mommy, you haven't been making any sacrifices."

My daughter was peering through the little opening in the plastic cover of the "sacrifice jar" we made for Lent this year. The repurposed oatmeal container, jazzed up with glitter glue and pictures of St. Therese of Lisieux, was more than half-filled with little slips of paper bearing descriptions of the various sacrifices family members had made for one another.

But she was right: every piece of paper bore the childlike scrawl of herself and her brother. I had not added anything to the sacrifice jar.


"If I wrote down every sacrifice I made for you in just a single day, the jar would explode," I retorted, and even though my daughter giggled, I instantly regretted the comment, sighing as I realized I did it again. Het a snide, self-pitying thought form on my lips and make its way into the world because for a brief moment I thought someone didn't appreciate my (imagine me sniffing injuredly here) hard work.

We sneer at the scribes and the Pharisees as Jesus describes them in the Gospel, lengthening their phylacteries and coveting the places of honor. But then I remember: nobody starts out meaning to be a jerk.

We want to do good things. We try to be holy. But it's hard, that burden weighs heavy on our back.

So, we murmur about it here and there. We stop to catch our breath. We glimpse other people looking at our burden with approval and admiration, and we breathe a little harder, groan a little deeper. And somewhere along the way the burden becomes an idol and our labor a performance. We dare not ask for help bearing it, for we prize too greatly the sweat of our own brow.


Everyday Stewardship






