

Sunday Reflection

Fr. Fd Smith

Isaiah 60:1-6; Ephesians 3:2-3a, 5-6; Matthew 2:1-12

Words tell us a lot about what we have been celebrating these days. "Advent" comes from Latin meaning "coming toward" or even "coming closer". "Christmas" means "Christ's Mass" or, if we go back to Latin again, "Christ is sent to us". This weekend we celebrate the feast of "Epiphany", and the word comes not from Latin, but Greek, and means "appearance" or "manifestation". This is, therefore, a time of expectation for the coming of Christ [Advent], the celebration of His coming into the world [Christmas], and the jubilation that results from the gift of Jesus being proclaimed to everyone [Epiphany]. And the feast of Epiphany is so important that it was celebrated in the Church two centuries before Christmas! Traditionally, it was celebrated on January 6th [the famed "Twelfth Day of Christmas"] but in recent years it has been moved in the dioceses of the United States to the nearest Sunday to make it more of a parish community celebration.

Why is this feast of Epiphany so important? It goes back to God's deep love for us, and the desire of that Love to share itself with others. What about our response? For us, in order to love Jesus in return, we must know Him, and in order to know Him we must hear about Him first. Epiphany celebrates the fact that God shared the Good News of Jesus so that we might really know Him and then respond with lives of love. Today reminds us that Jesus is called the Light of the World; the magi saw the brilliant light of a star that led them to Him; the prophet Isaiah proclaimed to God's people that they were to "Rise up in splendor, for your light has come!" Perhaps this feast is an opportunity to ask ourselves: How we are reflecting this light in our lives? How are we "manifesting" Jesus in our actions? How are we showing the joy that comes from knowing that Christ has come into the world? These are very good questions to reflect on as we enter the new year. Yes, words do tell us something important, and perhaps we can use the words of Advent, Christmas and Epiphany to guide us through the next twelve months in order to help us become better at proclaiming the presence of Christ who calls us to be light for the world and to share the Good News with everyone!

Epiphany House Blessing

Epiphany celebrates the joyous truth that God calls into relationship with Himself not only the chosen people of Israel, but the entire world. Families have traditionally "marked" this truth by the practice of "chalking" the front door of their homes at Epiphany. This visible mark on your door reminds your family, friends and guests that you hope they will find Christ in your home, just as did the Magi who followed the star to Bethlehem.

Here's how it works:

Using the chalk blessed at Church, your family writes the numerals for the New Year over or on your front door. In the middle of the numerals, add the initials "CMB." Tradition suggests that this comes from the Latin blessing, Christus mansionen benedicat, "May Christ bless this home." These are also the initials of the three wise men, known to us as Caspar, Melchior, and Balthasar. Both interpretations remind us of God's generous gift of gracing us with his presence. Here's the ritual to be prayed together as a family.

You'll need a Bible and the chalk blessed at Mass. All make the Sign of the Cross.

The leader begins:

Leader: Let us praise God, who fills our hearts and homes with peace. Blessed be the name of the Lord.

All: Now and forever.

Leader: After the Lord Jesus was born in Bethlehem, Magi from the east followed a star to Bethlehem where they found the new-born child and worshiped him. Mary and Joseph cared for Jesus and watched over him as he grew. As a man, Jesus preached about God's love for all, He favored the poor, healed the sick, and welcomed the children. He suffered and died for us and God raised him from the dead. He is here with us. Let us make our home a place of welcome and peace where all can see the goodness of Christ. Let us make our home a dwelling place of love. Let us pray: Gracious God, as a shining star once guided the Magi to the birthplace of the infant Jesus, help us who dwell here to be your light in the world. We ask this through Jesus Christ our Lord.

All: Amen.

The Gospel (and additional readings) for Epiphany may now be read by a family member: (Matthew 2:1-12, Isaiah 60:1-6, Psalm 72, or Ephesians 3:2-6). At the entrance of the home and with hands joined, the leader prays:

Leader: Lord God of heaven and earth, you revealed your only-begotten Son to every nation by the guidance of a star. Bless this house and all who live here. Fill us with the light of Christ, that our concern for others may reflect your love. We ask this through Christ our Lord.

All: Amen.

Family members then chalk the door with the inscription: 20+C+M+B+24

After which the leader concludes by inviting everyone to say the Our Father. Have a Blessed New Year!


