Sunday Reflection

Fr. Fd Smith

1 Samuel 3:3b-10, 19; 1 Corinthians 6:13c-15a, 17-20; John 1:35-42

Questions, questions, guestions! Life is filled with them, and some are more important than others. In our Gospel, Jesus asks a question of Andrew and John: "What are you looking for?" It's a good question for us also. What are we looking for? The answer to this is the beginning of our life's work: our vocation. When many people speak of a vocation they think primarily of a priest or a religious brother or sister. The reality is: every Christian has a vocation to follow, a life to lead, a path on which to journey. And every vocation story is important to hear because it involves God's call and a person's response.

God calls each of us to say, with our psalmist, "Here I am, Lord, I come to do your will." So, what is it about a vocation that is so important? First, we are dealing with one of the most intimate parts of a person's life. We are exploring the deepest level of existence. Along with this, we are exploring why someone would be willing to sacrifice an 'easy' life for a life of service [think of the self-sacrifice involved in a Christian marriage, in loving parenthood, in priestly ministry, or in religious life].

Finally, there is, for many of us, the guestion of whether we are capable of living out such important realities or not. Can we do what God asks? Can we accept the sacrifices involved? Can we be happy in a life that is demanding? The answer is a resounding YES. When we are living out God's plan for us, we will find a happiness we never could have imagined, by embracing the demands of a sacrificial Christian vocation. One of the most beautiful moments in the Gospels is found in today's reading: John the Baptist was standing with two of his disciples. And as he watched Jesus walk by, he said. 'Behold, the Lamb of God.' The two disciples heard what he said and followed Jesus. That's our vocation: to follow Jesus and point Him out to others. This is a life worth living, even with all its questions!



Epiphany House Blessing

Epiphany celebrates the joyous truth that God calls into relationship with Himself not only the chosen people of Israel, but the entire world. Families have traditionally "marked" this truth by the practice of "chalking" the front door of their homes at Epiphany. This visible mark on your door reminds your family, friends and guests that you hope they will find Christ in your home, just as did the Magi who followed the star to Bethlehem.

Here's how it works:

Using the chalk blessed at Church, your family writes the numerals for the New Year over or on your front door. In the middle of the numerals, add the initials "CMB." Tradition suggests that this comes from the Latin blessing, Christus mansionen benedicat, "May Christ bless this home." These are also the initials of the three wise men, known to us as Caspar, Melchior, and Balthasar. Both interpretations remind us of God's generous gift of gracing us with his presence. Here's the ritual to be prayed together as a family.

You'll need a Bible and the chalk blessed at Mass. All make the Sign of the Cross.

The leader begins:

Leader: Let us praise God, who fills our hearts and homes with peace. Blessed be the name of the Lord.

All: Now and forever.

Leader: After the Lord Jesus was born in Bethlehem, Magi from the east followed a star to Bethlehem where they found the new-born child and worshiped him. Mary and Joseph cared for Jesus and watched over him as he grew. As a man, Jesus preached about God's love for all, He favored the poor, healed the sick, and welcomed the children. He suffered and died for us and God raised him from the dead. He is here with us. Let us make our home a place of welcome and peace where all can see the goodness of Christ. Let us make our home a dwelling place of love. Let us pray: Gracious God, as a shining star once guided the Magi to the birthplace of the infant Jesus, help us who dwell here to be your light in the world. We ask this through Jesus Christ our Lord.

All: Amen.

The Gospel (and additional readings) for Epiphany may now be read by a family member: (Matthew 2:1-12, Isaiah 60:1-6, Psalm 72, or Ephesians 3:2-6). At the entrance of the home and with hands joined, the leader prays:

Leader: Lord God of heaven and earth, you revealed your only-begotten Son to every nation by the guidance of a star. Bless this house and all who live here. Fill us with the light of Christ, that our concern for others may reflect your love. We ask this through Christ our Lord.

All: Amen.

Family members then chalk the door with the inscription: 20+C+M+B+24

After which the leader concludes by inviting everyone to say the Our Father. Have a Blessed New Year!

In his first letter to the Thessalonians, Saint Paul tells us to "Pray without ceasing." (5:17). Perhaps as you think about that, it seems almost an impossible command because you have a job to go to, children to care for, dinner to cook, and sporting events to attend...you name it. You can feel defeated just reading that scripture. Fear not, because this isn't a new predicament, it's as old as Saint Paul's letter itself and there's a way to do it, with the Jesus Prayer.

The Jesus Prayer is an easy to learn, one sentence long, simple prayer that can help you on your quest to pray always. Here it is:

"Lord Jesus Christ, Son of God, have mercy on me, a sinner."

That's it, a one-liner that's even easy for your children to learn but huge in terms of always putting yourself in the presence of God and praying unceasingly.

Where is it from?

There are several places in the New Testament that echo the words of this prayer. In Luke (18:13), the tax collector approached God in prayer with the words "Be merciful to me a sinner". In Matthew (15:22), a Canaanite woman pleads "Have mercy on me, Lord, Son of David". The blind man, Bartimaeus, in Mark (15:22) begged "Jesus, Son of David, have mercy on me" when asking to be healed of his blindness.

Beyond the words of scripture, the Jesus Prayer can be traced back to the monasteries of the 3rd and 4th centuries, especially the eastern orthodox monasteries, where it was prayed repeatedly on knotted ropes called chotki.

The depth of this simple prayer

The Catechism in CCC 2668 tells us "The invocation of the holy name of Jesus is the simplest way of praying always. When the holy name is repeated often by a humbly attentive heart, the prayer is not lost by heaping up empty phrases..."

Beginning with "Lord", we make an act of worship and a confession of faith by calling Him our Lord. Then the name, Jesus, the Holy name revealed to Mary and Joseph by an angel, gives us an intimacy with Jesus' human nature. From that first-name-basis, we then call Him Christ, the anointed one, our savior. Our confession of faith continues as we call Him the Son of God and acknowledge that Jesus is God. Finally, in asking for Jesus to have mercy on us sinners, we acknowledge our wretched state before God and invoke His compassion both in forgiveness of our sins and in caring for our needs.

How to pray the Jesus Prayer

Breathe in and recite "Lord Jesus Christ, Son of God" and then exhale and pray "have mercy on me, a sinner." When we breathe intentionally, we become aware of this natural function of our body that we take for granted. This grounds us in the present moment and helps us to relax. When we are busy at work or at home, this combination of our breath and our prayer helps us to be aware of God's presence in our day. For those who like the feel of rosary beads in your hands during prayer, use them to pray

the Jesus Prayer on each bead just like on a chotki. By inhaling and exhaling the words of this prayer, we make it as natural as our breaths and soon find ourselves praying without ceasing.






