

Sunday Reflection

Fr. Ed Smith

Genesis 22:1-2, 9a, 10-13, 15-18; Romans 8:31b-34; Mark 9:2-10

Let's talk about faith for a moment. We know that faith can be life-giving, meaningful, and consoling. But at the same time, it is also a great challenge. The readings from the Book of Genesis and the Gospel of St. Mark give startling examples of how faith can challenge us, and the importance of our response. In our reading from the Book of Genesis, we hear about the call from God to Abraham to do something unthinkable: sacrifice his only son Isaac. It seems almost heartless of God to ask this of a father. But Abraham, in an amazing act of faith, does not argue, plead or bargain with God. Instead, he obeys and goes to the place God has chosen and prepares to sacrifice his son. Abraham trusts in God so completely, believing that, no matter how much he [Abraham] does not understand what God is asking of him, Abraham will obey. This does not mean it did not hurt. That little phrase describing his relationship with his son ["whom you love"] reveals that he is giving up what is nearest and dearest to him. But Abraham also knows that God does not ask for anything without a good reason. And, as we know, the story ends happily, with God's messenger stopping the sacrifice at the last minute, and Isaac being spared and returned to his father. Why then, if God was going to do this from the start, did He put Abraham through all of this? Perhaps it was to teach Abraham the depth of his own faith in God. He now knows that he will hold nothing back. At the same time, it was also a lesson for Israel about the totality of faith, and its demands on the believer, and that these demands, however difficult, are possible to meet. It is a beautiful moment: God showing just how important we are in the faith relationship with Him. But what about today's Gospel? Jesus is transfigured before his apostles, and they are called to put their faith totally in Him as the Son of God, accepting His word as the very Word of God, committing their lives to His service, and taking up the challenge of faith. Total trust. Now, what about us? It is good to ask for this gift of total trust so that, like Abraham and the apostles, we will be able to rise to the challenges of our faith, knowing that God never asks anything from us that is impossible...or useless. Abraham knew this; the apostles knew this; now it is our turn to know this too!

On the Mountain

Why climb a mountain? "Because it's there," George Mallory famously said, before perishing in an attempt to scale Mount Everest.

God is an event planner; every detail matters, and the location is most crucial of all. On the mountain, God demanded the sacrifice of Isaac. On the mountain, he restored Isaac to his father. On the mountain, Jesus was transfigured, revealed in all his mystifying glory as the beloved Son of God, the sacrifice which would finally balance the scale.

These things happened on a mountain because they could only happen on a mountain. The mountain is where the reckoning happens. It is where God takes, where He gives back, where He hands down.

In Lent, we encounter the mountain. We are removed from the distractions of ordinary life and placed outside the confines of our everyday habits. We find silence and mystery, pain and truth. We struggle and we become tired, and there is always a moment when we wonder if, perhaps, it would have been easier not to climb. There is always a moment when others look at us and think: "Why climb a mountain?"



But I do know a thing or two about struggling through a difficult experience. I know the strange peace that exists in the moment after it's all over and you catch your breath and realize you are a better, stronger, wiser person for the pain.

When Sacrifice Becomes Mundane

It seems to happen every year, like clockwork: we drag a bit, as we enter into the second week of Lent. On Ash Wednesday, we feel a bit like soldiers banging our shields, rushing into battle. "We're ready, God!" our hearts cry out. "Transform us through sacrifice! Your will be done!"

But by now, these Lenten resolutions are no longer novelties — they've joined the ranks of everyday inconveniences, which somehow are the hardest to bear. Because transformation, in real life, happens in inches, just as a battle is won slowly in the crash of one sword against another. It's not always a dramatic thing, to the naked eye. It's the perseverance in prayer despite weariness, or the continual denial of some pleasure even though there's that nagging voice in our minds saying: go ahead, God doesn't really mind.

It's a week when we all need a shock to the system — and wouldn't you know it, this Sunday God gives us a double-whammy of dramatic sacrificial scenes. We picture Abraham, who also cried "Ready!" when God called, never imagining what He would ask: the surrender of his long-awaited son. We see Christ himself transfigured, as God shows us what He is ready to give up for love of us.

We must remain committed, persevering daily in acknowledging that everything belongs to God. What we sacrifice, we simply give back to Him.

If God is for us, who can be against us? Can we still reply, "Ready!" when we hear the call of God?




