

Sunday Reflection

Fr. Ed Smith

Acts 10:34a, 37-43; Colossians 3:1-4; John 20:1-9

HAPPY EASTER! I remember someone on this wonderful day saying to me, years ago: "Thank God, Lent is finally over!" This was understandable, I suppose, since Lent often involves some items that might be seen as unpleasant: stricter discipline in our life; giving up certain things we like to eat; and taking a good, hard look at ourselves and being honest about what may need to change. But simply because Lent may be over is not nearly a good enough reason to celebrate with the energy, excitement and beauty that the Church provides for us each year on Easter Sunday. The power of Easter is so much more than just surviving Lent! It is the glorious finale of the foreshadowing of the Old Testament, the culmination of the life of Jesus, and the fulfillment of His great promise of love and life for His followers. Easter celebrates this love and life. And it takes our limited notion of what life is all about and expands it beyond anything we could ask for or imagine. Consider this: Jesus, in overcoming death, proclaims that God is more powerful than any destructive and evil reality in the world. It is Love that triumphs. It is Christ who reigns as King forever. And if that weren't enough, WE are called to share in His resurrection! Death will not have the final word in our lives; suffering is not meaningless. The promises of heaven, love and God's plan for us are real. The readings today confirm our faith in the Risen Jesus, but also remind us that every generation needs to learn what this really means for them. The dawning of each new day gives us an opportunity to embrace life and learn to love. And so let us do just that. Let us look at Easter with the vision of faith that enables us to exclaim, as the responsorial psalm tells us: "This is the day the Lord has made, let us rejoice and be glad!"





A Happy Ending Isn't the Whole Story

"Is there a happy ending?"

When my kids were young, we never made it past the first whiff of any narrative tension before I got this question. As soon as whatever princess or furry woodland animal who was the hero of the story got into any small scrape, they wanted that reassurance, "Is there a happy ending?"

I can't say I blame them. Don't we all feel that way sometimes? We enter into a relationship with someone or some situation, and we just want to protect ourselves. We want to know it's not going to go badly — or, if it does, that we will be able to come back from it. It's a human instinct, a reflex. Our inclination to protect ourselves makes it so that we sometimes want to press fast-forward on the bad stuff and skip straight ahead to the happily-everafter.

Easter is the ultimate happy ending. It's the day of miracles. The day when all the stones roll away and all the sins are forgiven. It's the day that puts everything right.

But if we learned anything from this week – from the Passion and death of the Lord – it's that we can't press fast-forward on the hardships of life. That tension, that loss, that fear – it's crucial, isn't it? As Catholics, we are who we are because of Easter. But Easter doesn't happen without Good Friday.

So, does the story of salvation have a happy ending? We know it does. But we also remember that the ending isn't all that matters.

Question & Answer

Differences Between Priests & Brothers

Question:

What is spiritual communion, and do you need to be in a state of grace to receive it?

Answer:

The practice of making a "spiritual communion" dates back several centuries and St. Thomas Aquinas described it as "an ardent desire to receive Jesus in the Holy Sacrament and a loving embrace as though we had already received Him." Traditionally, a prayer of spiritual communion has been used by those who are unable to receive sacramental communion because of health, inability to attend Mass, or who cannot receive communion because of grave sin. This practice has been encouraged by many saints and spiritual writers and most recently Pope Francis encouraged the practice when the realities of the COVID-19 pandemic prevented so many Catholics from taking part in the Mass or receiving sacramental communion.

Although the graces offered in spiritual communion are not the same as those offered in the sacramental communion of the Mass, this practice is still a powerful opportunity to express our desire for union with the Lord and to be united with Christ and the Church, even in an imperfect way. ©LPi


