# Sunday Reflection

Fr. Ed Smith

#### Acts 4:32-35; 1 John 5:1-6; John 20:19-31

If we call someone a "Doubting Thomas" it implies that they are annoying to us in their refusal to accept as true what we are telling them. The use of this term begins with today's Gospel. Indeed, this seems logical since, after Jesus' resurrection, it is the apostle Thomas who says, "Unless I see...I will not believe." This sounds like a sad statement to make in the aftermath of what happened at Easter. However, because Thomas was honest, Jesus invited him to see, to touch and to believe. St. Gregory the Great says that this is why Thomas is one of the greatest disciples. Thomas says what no one else will say. And Jesus responds with love, understanding what we need as human beings.

We do need to see and touch and believe. This becomes clearer as we celebrate the liturgy time after time. We, as a community, see the elements of bread and wine; we hear the Word of God proclaimed in the scriptures; we *experience* being part of the community of faith gathered together in the Church; we *touch* and taste the Body and Blood of Christ; and we can echo Thomas when he learns to *believe* as he says, "My Lord and my God!" Perhaps, then, Thomas is not so much the "doubter," but rather the one person who says what everyone else is thinking but does not have the courage to say out loud.

Remember: faith is not easy; it demands the deepest part of us, calls us to trust completely and be honest about what we are feeling. But no matter how difficult this is, it's worth it. Faith is its own reward, and through faith in Jesus we can begin to become like the early Christian community described in the Acts of the Apostles: "One in heart and mind." Let's pray for one another during this Easter season!

# The Invisible Battle: Pope Leo XIII's St. Michael Prayer and Spiritual Warfare

The history of the great prayer to Saint Michael the Archangel comes shrouded in a bit of mystery. We know the prayer was written by Pope Leo XIII, who reigned as pope from 1878-1903. During his reign, it is well documented that he re-founded the Vatican astronomical observatory, wrote eleven encyclicals on the rosary, improved Vatican relations with the major powers in Europe, and insisted the clergy study the theology of Saint Thomas Aquinas. He was also the first pope to be recorded and filmed. So why don't we have the details on why Pope Leo XIII composed the Saint Michael prayer? Most likely because Pope Leo XIII never published what led to writing the prayer.

What we do know comes to us from both recorded facts and a bit of pious legends. In 1895, Pope Pius IX ordered a series of prayers to be prayed by priests in Italy after the Mass to ward off the negative attacks on the Catholic Church by revolutionary leaders of the time. These prayers were modified twice by his successor, Pope Leo XIII, once in 1884 and once in 1886, and they became known as the Leonine prayers. The 1886 version contained what we now know as the St. Michael prayer. The Leonine prayers were eventually prayed after Mass throughout the world from 1884 – 1964.

The reason Pope Pius XIII wrote the St. Michael prayer is more recorded legend than recorded fact. Sometime between 1884 and 1886, Pope Leo XIII was said to have had a vision during the celebration of Mass. The pope became pale and had a fearful look on his face as the vision was happening. Some accounts say he even collapsed and had no pulse. The vision was of demonic, smoke-like spirits who were beginning to gather around Rome. Other accounts tell of how Pope Leo saw how devils were raving against the Church with seductive powers, but that St Michael showed up to cast Satan and his demons back to hell. As time went on, this account was elaborated upon to include an actual conversation between Jesus and Satan. In that conversation, Satan bradded that he could destroy the Church in 75-100 years if Jesus were to just give him that time and a greater power over those who serve Satan. Jesus then granted those requests to Satan, confident that Satan would not prevail. This is all very reminiscent of the story of Job.

Back to the facts. Saint Michael appears in scripture in Daniel, Jude, and Revelation. Catholic Tradition and Scripture give Michael four offices or jobs:

To fight against Satan.

To rescue the souls of the faithful from the power of the enemy, especially at the hour of death.

To be the champion of God's people and the patron of the Church.

To call away men's souls from their earthly life and bring them to judgment.

Whether Pope Leo XIII's vision was ever recorded by him or not, it's a comfort to know that Saint Michael protects us from Satan and His demonic attacks. Call on him when you are tempted or can see the action of the deceiver and accuser in your life.

#### Written in the Wounds

For all the condemnation Thomas the Doubter has received in 2000 years of homilies, I think there's something to admire in him.

Thomas is not unique. We all waver at some point, overcome by hesitation, distracted by the clamor of the world which seeks at every turn to shout above the whisper of the divine.

Thomas knows what he saw on Good Friday: his friend nailed to a cross, a sword driven through his body. He saw the blood and the water. He saw these things with his own eyes, eyes given to him by God, eyes which have never failed him before. And God doesn't ask us to suspend reality to believe in Him. He only asks us to be discerning about how that reality is interpreted in our hearts.

Thomas knows the man before him is either a fraud, preying on the hopes and anxieties of the traumatized disciples, or he is the Christ, the Savior of the world, accomplisher of impossible things. But where to look, to tell the difference?

Satan once appeared to the great mystic saint, Teresa of Avila, disguised as Jesus. She knew instantly that he was a fraud. Enraged, he demanded to know where his deception had failed. "You have no wounds," she told him simply.

Could we have accepted a savior who did not bleed? I don't think we could, because sooner or later, we would all stand before him and say, "Here is where the world hurt me. Here, and here, and here. What about you?" Christ can point to his hands, his feet, his side. "Here, and here, and here," he can say. "And I overcame them all."

It's the wounds, you see. The truth is in the wounds.

# Everyday Stewardship

What do you own and what owns you? You can find this question asked many times in several different contexts. Are you looking to find some kind of financial freedom? How about trying to live simply in a complex world? Has a mountain of stuff invaded your home garage to the point where parking a car inside is only a dream?

The early Church practiced a radical form of fellowship called koinonia, which literally means "sharing in common." Those who had homes and other major possessions would sell them and then place the proceeds in the care of the Apostles to be shared with the entire community. People focus mostly on the fact that people sold all their possessions for the benefit of the community. However the real point is the action that occurred after every selling: the proceeds were given to Church authority, in essence, to God first. I wasn't just selling my house and then giving the money to random people. My offering was to God and it was for the Apostles (those who personally encountered Jesus and now represented him on earth) to decide how to divide up the wealth.

Why do such a thing? One could say it was so that no one wanted for anything. If we push that thinking too far, as some in history have done, we can create a system that takes from some to give to others. Nothing was taken from anyone in that first Christian community. It was freely given. And perhaps the reason why people were moved to do so lies at the heart of stewardship: because all we have already belongs to God anyway.




