# Sunday Reflection

Fr. Ed Smith

#### Acts 3:13-15, 17-19; 1 John 2:1-5a; Luke 24:35-48

As we continue to celebrate the Easter season, very soon the second-grade students from both St. Margaret of York and St. Columban parishes will be receiving their First Holy Communion. Throughout this year they have been praying and studying about Jesus in the Eucharist, and what He means for their lives. Among other things, this involves an experience called "Jesus Day", which is a time to reflect on and prepare for this wonderful sacrament. And it is not by chance that our young people's first reception of Jesus in Holy Communion occurs during the Easter Season. This is a time when we remember the gift of the Risen Jesus with thanksgiving [In fact, the word, "Eucharist" means "Thanksgiving"!]. We also recall Jesus' gift of Himself in bread and wine, the sending of the Holy Spirit, and the growth of the early Church.

This new Church community was, and remains, sustained by the celebration of the Eucharist, which brings us together as God's people, nourishes us, gives us strength to be witnesses of His love, and helps us see the presence of God in one another. We are part of a long and glorious history of faith. In the Gospel today, Jesus speaks of Moses, the prophets and the psalms. He shows how God has been with His people all along the way, and that Jesus Himself is the culmination of that journey of faith. Our Church is founded on this same faith: God is with us, Jesus is risen, we are God's people, and we share in the mission of being witnesses of Jesus in the world. To do this, we need many things, including the love of Jesus, the proclamation of the Word of God, the community of faith, and the sacraments of the Church.

So, in a sense, every day is a "Jesus Day" for us, because He is central to every day of our lives. Let us pray for our young people who are preparing to receive our Lord for the first time in the sacrament of the Eucharist. And let us pray for one another, that we will appreciate what we have been given, and live out this holy sacrament by bringing Jesus to everyone as we continue to celebrate the power of Easter!



# The Kreidler Family Educational Gift

Since St. Margaret of York's origin in March of 1984, our community has been blessed with wonderful spiritual stewards such as our third pastor, Father Tom Kreidler. From 1996 through 2008, Father Tom guided the St. Margaret of York community. He spiritually nurtured and encouraged our community to grow in faith. In addition, we were blessed to know his family on a personal level through his homilies. Through these interactions, we have come to love and recognize the Kreidler Family members as deeply devoted to the Catholic faith with a strong commitment to Catholic education. This devotion to our Lord and commitment to Catholic education provided the inspiration for The Kreidler Family Educational Gift.

The Kreidler Family Educational Gift is an annual award that recognizes an active St. Margaret of York youth parishioner who lovingly reaches out to others in the name of Christ. This youth is a current or incoming high school student who demonstrates a willingness to serve others at SMOY and the community at large. Additional characteristics taken into consideration are participation in our parish activities and sound academic standing.

Each year, SMOY's Pastoral Council will accept applications for this educational gift. The amount of the gift is \$1000 and, when awarded, shall be applied directly towards tuition expenses for a Catholic high school. The gift is nonrenewable, but may be awarded to the same St. Margaret of York youth parishioner a maximum of four times. SMOY's Pastoral Council will determine the recipient, taking into account the characteristics described above. The parish office will be responsible for overseeing the financial aspects of the gift. The recipient will be recognized in May and the award money will be sent directly to the youth's Catholic school of choice.




# Everyday Stewardship

If you ask me to tell you about one of my sons, my daughter, or my wife, I could spend quite some time elaborating on them as individuals and my interactions with them throughout the years. An authentic relationship leads each party into a rich knowledge of the other. If I have little to say about someone other than some incidental information or gossip, I cannot claim to really know him or her.

Indeed, every relationship has expectations. If we do not know the needs of the other or the responses expected in living out the relationship, we easily create division and separation. I do certain things for my children because I am a parent. I respond in certain ways to my wife based upon her needs. If I am oblivious, or just don't care, the relationship will move on a path toward hurt, pain, and in some instances, permanent separation.

To know Jesus is to love Jesus. The key is you actually have to know him. Knowing him is listening to his words and keeping his commands. Just like in all relationships, we will fall short at times. However, because we know the expectations we can then make amends and continue to grow together. So if I asked you to tell me about this friend of yours named Jesus, what would you say?

# **Practicing Catholic**

#### The Twist Ending

Any reader of psychological thrillers will come across the "dead main character trope" fairly often. This is the famous Sixth Sense twist ending (I would say "spoiler alert," but the movie is older than most of the people who work in Youth Ministry at your archdiocese, so you've probably seen it by now) where the reader finds that the main character has been dead for all or most of the story.

I'm always a little disappointed when this happens. It delivers shock value, sure, but it also undermines everything that happens in the story. You've come on a journey with this character, only to find out that nothing you saw transpire was real in the way you thought it was. You feel a little stupid, because the whole time you only had part of the truth.

I suspect Jesus knows this about us. He knows we don't like to have the rug pulled out. It's why he is so up-front about his humanity following the resurrection. See how Jesus, resurrected, shows the disciples his feet, his hands. See how he asks them for food and lets them watch him eat it. See how this creates in them an understanding, a belief.

The humanity of Jesus Christ is absolutely crucial. It's what bridges the divide between the sons of Eve and the God she defied. Our reconciliation with God cannot happen unless human flesh pays the price that will balance the scales. Human flesh: skin that can tear and bleed, bones that can break, a mouth that can thirst, a stomach that can ache with hunger.

The passion and death of Jesus Christ is not a thriller with a twist ending: he was a ghost the whole time! The twist, if anything, is this: he was human the whole time.




