## Sunday Reflection

Fr. Ed Smith

Acts 1:1-11; Ephesians 4:1-13; Mark 16:15-20

Happy Mother's Day! On this solemnity of the Ascension of Our Lord, we celebrate the gift of Jesus and the gift of our moms. And they are really not so far apart. Both give us life and love. Both give us lessons in how to live. Both expect us to follow their example. And both offer us a life of optimism and joy. And the readings for the Solemnity of the Ascension show us that true optimism, rooted in Jesus, is the most Christian way to live. Consider this: The Apostles watch as Jesus leaves the earth, and they do not want Him to go, and it is certainly a moment of grief for them because they will miss Him. But, at the same time, it is a moment of glory, as Jesus ascends to heaven and promises to send the Holy Spirit to enable them to preach His Gospel.

St. Mark confirms this in his Gospel account when he states that the disciples did exactly what Jesus said. They "went forth and preached everywhere, while the Lord worked with them..." What a beautiful reality of our faith: knowing that the Lord works with us! What a cause for great optimism, even in the midst of a confused and sometimes brutal world. What a reason to echo the "shouts of joy" from the Responsorial Psalm as we live as God's people, knowing that Jesus is with us, sending the Holy Spirit to sanctify us, and enabling us to "go into the whole world, and proclaim the Gospel to every creature!"

So, this is a feast of the glory of Christ, the power of faith, the call to bring God's Word to everyone, and the joy that is given to us as we celebrate the gift of our mothers. Thank you, moms, for the gift of life, the example of optimism, the lessons of goodness, and the joy that you have given to so many of us!

## Pond and Fountain Change

There are many nice parts of our campus here at St. Margaret of York Parish. One of them is the water feature behind the church. However, this has been more and more of a concern. The fountain and pond are unattended, and small children have fallen in the water. The thought of having something on our property that could be dangerous to children is frightening. The last thing we want to happen is that one of our little ones could be placed in a potentially treacherous situation.

Along with the hazard of water itself, the pond is used by deer and other animals who leave their droppings at the bottom as they go in for a drink of water. This brings bacteria into the mud, making the water itself possibly toxic for anyone who might inadvertently swallow some of it or get it in their eyes.

Also, because of the slime, bacterial growth and algae, the bottom of the pond is very slick and slimy, making it very easy for someone to slip and fall and be unable to get back up on their own. And if that were not enough, the pond itself has a plastic liner, and deer have very sharp hooves which slice into it. So, the liner is now in shreds, making the water unhealthy for the fish.

Therefore, after much consultation, thought and prayer, we will fill the pond with good soil, and plant a garden in honor of Our Lady, whose beautiful statue is already present there. Along with that, our parish has someone who will contribute the fill-dirt for the pond, a high school parishioner who will plant the flowers and greenery, and a future Eagle Scout who will build new benches for people to use as they go to our Mary Garden to pray.

I think that this will be a beautiful and safe addition to our parish. I am grateful for the many people who have helped make this decision, and who will be part of the completion of this project.

#### The Truth We Cannot See

I only pray out loud when I want my kids to hear what I'm saying.

I know what you're thinking - hypocrites in the synagogue and the street corner; go to your room and shut the door - but I think if Jesus had to raise children he would understand where I'm coming from. I pray out loud not because I want my kids to think I'm holy and not because I want them to admire me but because I want them to know how broken I am, how desperately I rely on the mercy and love of God.

It's also a really effective way to send a message. "God, I'm sorry I've been losing my patience today. Please help me. And send your Holy Spirit to make these kids stop fighting."

Vocal prayer, in front of other people, is an incredibly vulnerable action, so it strikes me whenever Jesus chooses to pray out loud in front of his disciples. Surely, mental prayer was something of a perpetual state for him. I imagine Jesus was ceaselessly in conversation with his Father in heaven throughout even the most ordinary of days. So, when he chooses to make those communications public, my ears perk up.

He wants his kids to hear what he's saying.

In John, chapter 17, we see that he wants us to remember who we are. His disciples are about to see things that will shake the very foundations of their faith. The only way they will make it to the other side is if they remember that truth does not consist only of what we can see with our eyes.


This is the same truth in which we have been consecrated. We belong to this truth in a way the world will never understand or accept. It is the truth we cannot see.

#### **Commitment to the Journey**

In the Church, we observe a liturgical calendar that takes us through the life of highlights fundamental Jesus and doctrines of our faith. Starting with this Sunday, our observance of the Easter Season continues for one more week until the celebration of Pentecost. While many outside of the Church only see Easter as a one-day celebration, we celebrate for an entire season, much like we do during Christmas as well. Of course, this calendar only serves to remind us and point to greater realities.

We are not called to be more generous at Easter or Christmas than we are on other days. We do not choose to love more during one time of the year. The fact is that Jesus is alive right now and at all times is calling us to give of ourselves.

When we make an intentional decision to follow Jesus and adopt a stewardship way of life, we commit ourselves to this journey 365 days a year. We are an Easter people at all times. The high and low points of our journey are not tied to a liturgical year, but instead to our own experiences of life and shortcomings. A season or holiday may make it easier to have a giving attitude, but we need to do the same when little around us is pointing us in that direction. It is sometimes when few are paying attention that love and generosity are most needed.

#### Ascension of the Lord

#### Ouestion:

Couldn't Jesus have done more good if he stayed on earth, rather than ascended into heaven?

#### Answer:

This is an interesting question! During his earthly life, Jesus gave sight to the blind, healed paralytics, drove out



demons, and fed thousands with only a few loaves of bread. Imagine what he could have done if he'd never ascended into heaven! Imagine what our world could be! It's an interesting thought to consider, especially as the world faces challenges that only seem to deepen and expand. Yet at the Last Supper, Jesus says, "It is better for you if I go." Why? His response must have seemed strange to the Apostles at the time. In his place, Jesus says, he will send the Paraclete, the Comforter, the Advocate. He promises to send the Holy Spirit.

Jesus' departure allows the Apostles to become the leaders he has formed them to be. Jesus is no longer situated in only one geographical location, and his Church will never be a political kingdom. Soon after the Ascension, we celebrate Pentecost - the descent of the Holy Spirit and the radical empowerment of the followers of Jesus. We share in that empowerment and in that mission. 
