

Sunday Reflection

Fr. Ed Smith

Genesis 3:9-15; 2 Corinthians 4:13-5:1; Mark 3:20-35

Let's take a look at the final section of this weekend's Gospel. Jesus is told: "Your mother and your brothers and your sisters are outside waiting for you." He responds: "Who are my mother and my brothers?" Then He concludes: "Whoever does the will of God is my brother and sister and mother." At first glance, it seems that Jesus is belittling His own mother, Mary...but really, we know better. We realize that He would never do this. Why, then, does He say this?

The Gospels are unanimous in depicting Jesus precisely as the one who came to do His Father's will. Jesus reminds us of this as He prays to His Father in the garden of Gethsemane the night before His crucifixion: "Not my will, but yours be done." Also, when asked how we are to pray, He teaches the Our Father, in which is this line: "Thy will be done."

The "Will" of God, the plan for our salvation, the path that God has for each of us, is central to the life and teaching of Jesus. So, when He says that the one who does the will of His Father is his mother, it is not an insult to Mary, but rather an exaltation. Jesus holds up Mary as the supreme example of a human person who embraced and lived out the will of God for her. We are all called to follow God's will. In doing so, we become the family God intends us to be. We become the people we were born to be. We become the saints that we can ultimately be. All by following the will of our Father, we can, like Mary, bring the face of Jesus into the world!

Campus Safety: Essential Reminders During Construction

Now that summer is here and SMOY is in full construction site mode, here are a few safety reminders for us all:

1. The school building is a construction site and as such, no one but construction workers can access the building until further notice. The school office will be hard at work, but there will not be regular business hours. Please contact the school if you need to make an appointment.

2. The only legal way to make a left turn onto the SMOY campus from Columbia Rd is at the traffic light. Please do not attempt a left turn from Columbia Rd into the Right In/Right Out driveway. We have had quite a few near accidents between those illegally entering what is an exit only lane and those attempting to exit at the same time.

3. There will be construction vehicles entering and exiting the property. Please be mindful and cautious.

4. Because of the construction, the playground and basketball hoops will be closed and off limits until further notice. This is to protect our children and to keep them away from what will be an active construction site with many moving parts all day long.

Thank you for not attempting to enter the construction site at any time. We will be posting pictures and short videos of the progress on a regular basis as this exciting new entrance and office space takes shape.We also want to thank you in advance for helping us keep the SMOY campus safe during this phase of our growth. 

What SMOY Has Meant to Me

Parishioner Share their Experience in Celebration of Our 40 Years

"My neighbors, the Hunekes told me about SMOY with masses at JF Burns. Out of curiosty, I was there the following Sunday with Fr. Obermeyer as Celebrant roughly during the 1st year. I was a member of a Parish during its early growth and have continue to watch it become the Parish it is. At the first festival, at Landen lake across from JF Burns, my band, Headliner was performing. Fr. Obermeyer noticed me and commented, You're a member of the Parish. I said yes. He said we need a keyboardist as mass was done with guitars. I declined saying I was a pop musician. Father pursued the idea and 4 weeks later I was the keyboardist on Sundays, some Saturdays and some Weddings until Easter, 2003 when they hired Javier Clavere." — John Ebbers

"Joe was transferred here and one of his employees told him about a new school by twenty mile house. Our oldest was going into second grade and we visited every Catholic School in this area. Through the years as we prayed for many more beautiful SMOY souls as they prepared for their Heavenly reward, I knew this parish had something quite special. SMOY's funerals are joyous celebrations of life. I thank God for leading our family to this parish. "We Were All In" from the humble beginning in 1984, even though most of us had never heard of a Saint called Margaret of York. It was an honor to be the Lector at the first Mass celebrated at Kings Junior High.

It has meant the opportunity to be involved in the school and parish community in ways that I never imagined. Fast friends were made packing cookies for Kairos, chaperoning class field trips, working in the Respect Life Booth at the annual festival, teaching PRP, and so much more. SMOY was the richest, most important part of our family's life.

When Father Tom was our Pastor, the Steve and Debbie Burns family offered to donate a beautiful statue of Mary to the new church, but it had been in their home for a long time, and was in need of clean up and some paint. Debbie asked if our daughter, Kristin would consider doing the work, since she was guite good at art. She agreed, and before we knew it, a six foot statue of Mary arrived at our front door! We hadn't expected such a large visitor, but we set her down in our dining room (safely away from dogs and smaller children), and the restoration slowly became a family affair. We all pitched in to make Mary as beautiful as we could. We were a bunch of amateurs, but somehow, it all came together...with some Divine intervention! Mary now stands in the corner of the new church, and among other things, the gold leaf on her veil is the very steady work of Kristin's hand's. Father Tom must have liked what we did, because shortly after that, we got another request to completely refurbish the Pieta, which is now in the hall near the old Eucharistic Chapel. We enjoyed Jesus and Mary in our dining room for about three months! When it was finished, this statue was dedicated to Father Tom's Dad, who had recently passed away. What a beautiful, humbling honor it was to be trusted to do this work, especially since it was a learning experience for the whole family.
