

Sunday Reflection

Fr. Ed Smith

Baruch 5:1-9; Philippians 1:4-6, 8-11; Luke 3:1-6

This past Friday, December 6, we celebrated the Feast of St. Nicholas. When I was a child, this day was a sort of prelude to Christmas: we would find small gifts in our stockings, along with fruit and perhaps some candy. It reminded us that the size and cost of the gift was secondary to the generosity of the giver and the gratitude of the receiver.

With this in mind, it is a happy coincidence that this weekend of Advent began with Friday: remembering St. Nicholas, a man of great kindness and generosity who changed many lives, and ends with Monday: which is the Feast [moved this year from Sunday, December 8] of the Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary, who changed every life by bringing Jesus into the world!

In our Gospel for today we see that the mission of Jesus changes the world, and St. Luke makes sure that we know how this mission is accomplished within the political and religious reality of the time: Tiberius Caesar is emperor, Pilate is governor, Annas and Caiaphas are the Jewish high priests. All of this serves as the backdrop for what it really important, proclaimed by the final line of this Gospel: "All flesh shall see the salvation of God!"

This is the message of the Prophet Isaiah waiting for the Messiah. This is the message of John the Baptist as he prepares the world for the coming of Jesus. This is the message of the Church as we journey through Advent, taking time to become ready for Christ, the Messiah, who comes to bring salvation to all. Our response, then, should be joy, peace and prayer. Joy: because we know we are saved by Jesus. Peace: because we are part of God's eternal plan of love. Prayer: because God's care for us calls us into an intimate relationship with Him. So, as we reflect on St. Nicholas, Our Lady, Advent, family, and especially Jesus, let us be people of joy, peace and prayer!





Family Connection

Fucharist

You probably know that Jesus gave us the Eucharist at the Last Supper, but did you know that the Eucharist is foretold even at Jesus' birth? Jesus is born in the City of Bethlehem. In Hebrew, the word Beth means "house" and the word Lechem means "bread". When you put these together, Bethlehem means "House of Bread" in Hebrew. Also, at His humble birth, He was laid in a manger. A manger is a feeding trough where animals would come to eat. Jesus, who calls himself the Bread of Life and who is to become the food for the world, is born in a city called the House of Bread and laid in a feeding trough. Celebrate the miracle of the Incarnation and the Eucharist by spending time as a family making your own house of bread - a Gingerbread house!

Everyday Stewardship


I remember growing up in Catholic school and having to make construction paper Advent wreaths every single year! The little yellow flames would be cut out and held until each new candle was lit. Great idea, except for the fact that the chance you could find the flames greatly diminished as each week passed. I will bet over 50% of the wreaths never received a 4th flame! Of course by then, most kids in elementary school had moved on to Christmas. Christmas was not a day. It was an entire experience of vacation from school.

You may or may not have an Advent wreath in your home or office, but those flames are rather insignificant to the flame that should be burning in our hearts during this season. How are you finding ways to light your fire? How are you preparing the way for Christ to come into your life and the lives of those around you in a more profound way?

The ritual of an Advent wreath is a good idea for anyone. But don't think that your preparations are done simply because you have one. You are called to be a flame to others during this season, reminding them of why we celebrate this time at all. Each person is a candle to be lit, and you have the gifts, given to you by God, to light them. At Christmas, you want God to look at you and see all the light generated by those He lit through you. Now is the time. Don't wait until Advent is almost over. You might not be able to find your own flames if you wait too long.

The Straight Path

Ten to fifteen years ago the Department of Transportation decided that it would be fun to give everyone in my zip code something to complain about and replaced most of our major intersections with roundabouts.

This wouldn't be so irksome, I suppose, if I understood how to navigate a roundabout. In theory I do, I've read all the rules and I've watched those cute little YouTube videos where they show you which car is supposed to go at what time. But theory and practice are rather different. And the bottom line is, I never approach a roundabout without taking a deep, anxious breath and tightening my grip on the steering wheel, not entirely sure what my next move should be.

I think of roundabouts every time I hear today's Gospel reading, where John the Baptist echoes Isaiah in beseeching us to make straight the paths of the Lord. See, I always think I've made a straight path between me and God. I go to Mass. I go to Confession. I say my prayers.


He can get to me if He wants, I tell myself.

But without realizing it, I put up roundabouts. I make rules. You go here, God, and then I go here. I'll do this, God, but first You do this. You stay in your lane, and I stay in mine. Eventually I find myself taking a different route altogether; the road that stretches between me and Him is too daunting. I start avoiding it.

Sometimes I think God wants the path to be straight not for Himself but for us. He can handle a round-about. But He knows that when we must run to Him, we have to do it without thinking. In the dark. In fear, in anxiety.

So, this Advent, beware the roundabouts. Make straight the path.






