Sunday Reflection

Fr. Ed Smith

The Fifth Sunday of Lent

Isaiah 43: 16-21; Philippians 3: 8-14; John 8:1-11

We are told every day that there is something "new" to think about: a new product to buy, a new person to meet, a new situation to deal with...so many things, in fact, that it is difficult to attend to them all. But when the Prophet Isaiah gives us the very word of God and says: "I am doing something new!" we had better pay attention.

This weekend, the Fifth Sunday of Lent, we are taught that God is not bound to the past, and to rules that we have put in place without His consent. Instead, the amazing love of God bursts through old stereotypes, expectations, and fears. We do not have to be afraid to look at the future, because if our faith teaches us anything, it's that the future is never a threat. God is with us, and is showing us the way, even during confusing and difficult times. In the end, it is God's love and forgiveness, which Jesus shows us perfectly, that enables us to go forward in our lives with confidence and trust.

In our Gospel, the woman caught in adultery should, by law, be put to death. Jesus steps in and shows that this law is not the last word. LOVE is the final word. This is new for the people who witness this encounter. It gives them, and us, a new understanding of God's desire to forgive, while still dealing with the sin that has been committed [Jesus tells the woman: "Go, and from now on do not sin anymore."]. Let us pray that we will be attentive to the all the new things that God puts before us, knowing that He is always ready to give, to forgive, and to do great things for us!


Reds Baseball Game, May 15



The Sacrament of Holy Orders

The Sacrament of Holy Orders is the Sacrament through which a man is ordained to become a member of the clergy. The Catechism tells us that it is "the sacrament through which the mission entrusted by Christ to his apostles continues to be exercised in the Church until the end of time."

Description of Holy Orders

Holy Orders ordains a man into one of the three degrees of the clerical state: deacon, priest, or bishop. Each level of ordination has specific roles and responsibilities. The Sacrament is a response to God's call to serve the Church and His people, and it is grounded in the apostolic tradition handed down through Jesus and the apostles.

Deacon: The first degree of Holy Orders is the diaconate. Deacons assist priests in their pastoral duties. They are ordained to serve in liturgical roles, preach, baptize, witness marriages, and assist in the administration of sacraments. The transitional diaconate is a step toward the priesthood while the permanent diaconate is for men who are called to remain deacons perhaps because they are married or are not called to the priesthood.

Priest: The second degree of Holy Orders is the priesthood. Priests are the ministers of the Sacrament of the Eucharist. They have the authority to celebrate Mass, forgive sins through the Sacrament of Reconciliation, anoint the sick, witness marriages, and perform many other liturgical functions. Priests are responsible for pastoral care, preaching the word of God, and shepherding their congregations.

Bishop: The third degree of Holy Orders is the episcopate. Bishops are the successors of the apostles and hold the fullness of the sacrament of Holy Orders. They are responsible for overseeing a diocese, teaching the faith, administering sacraments (particularly the Sacrament of Confirmation), governing their diocese, and ensuring that the faith is handed down.

In the Catholic Church, only baptized, celibate men can be ordained priests and bishops, as this follows the example of Christ, who chose only men to be his apostles. Permanent Deacons may be married if they received the Sacrament of Holy Matrimony prior to Holy Orders.

Effects of the Sacrament of Holy Orders

The effects of Holy Orders are both sacramental and spiritual. The Sacrament imparts grace and confers a particular responsibility to serve God's people.

Indelible Mark: Holy Orders confer an indelible mark on the

soul, which is permanent and cannot be undone, even if the man were to leave priestly ministry or be laicized. This sacred character signifies that the individual is set apart for a life of service to God and the Church.

Grace for Ministry: Holy Orders bestows special grace, empowering the ordained to perform the sacred duties entrusted to him. For example, a priest receives the grace necessary to administer the Sacraments validly and to serve the faithful with authority and love. The grace also enables the ordained to live a life of holiness and integrity while fulfilling his responsibilities.

Authority: Through ordination, the Catechism says "The grace of the Holy Spirit proper to this sacrament is configuration to Christ as Priest, Teacher, and Pastor, of whom the ordained is made a minister."

Spiritual Transformation: Holy Orders transforms the person spiritually, imbuing them with a deeper relationship to Christ and to the Church. The ordained minister is not only a servant of God's people but also a witness of Christ's love and mercy.

Matter and Form of Holy Orders

Like all seven Sacraments, Holy Orders has both matter and form.

Matter: The matter of Holy Orders is the laying on of hands by the bishop. This gesture, which has biblical roots, symbolizes the transmission of spiritual authority and the imparting of the Holy Spirit. The laying on of hands is accompanied by the prayer of consecration.

Form: The form of the sacrament is the specific prayer said by the bishop during the ordination. This prayer varies depending on the rank of the ordination. For example, during the ordination of a deacon, the bishop prays, "Send your Holy Spirit upon this servant of yours, who will be ordained to the diaconate." In the case of priests and bishops, the prayer includes requests for the grace and strength to carry out their sacred responsibilities.

Conclusion

The Sacrament of Holy Orders is an essential part of the Catholic Church, providing the ministers needed to carry out the mission of Christ in the world. It ensures that the Church's teachings, Sacraments, and pastoral care continue through the centuries. Empowered by the grace of the Holy Spirit, men are consecrated for a life of service to God and the Church. This Sacrament not only affects the individual who is ordained but also benefits the entire Church, as it strengthens and nurtures the faith of the People of God.

The Kreidler Family Educational Gift


The Kreidler Family Educational Gift is an annual award that recognizes an active St. Margaret of York youth parishioner who lovingly reaches out to others in the name of Christ. This youth is a current or incoming high school student who demonstrates a willingness to serve others at SMOY and the community at large. Additional characteristics taken into consideration are participation in our parish activities and sound academic standing.

Each year, SMOY's Pastoral Council will accept applications for this educational gift. The amount of the gift is \$1000 and, when awarded, shall be applied directly towards tuition expenses for a Catholic high school. The gift does not automatically renew, but may be awarded to the same St. Margaret of York youth parishioner a maximum of four times. SMOY's Pastoral Council will determine the recipient, taking into account the characteristics described above. The parish office will be responsible for overseeing the financial aspects of the gift. The recipient will be recognized in May and the award money will be sent directly to the youth's Catholic school of choice.
