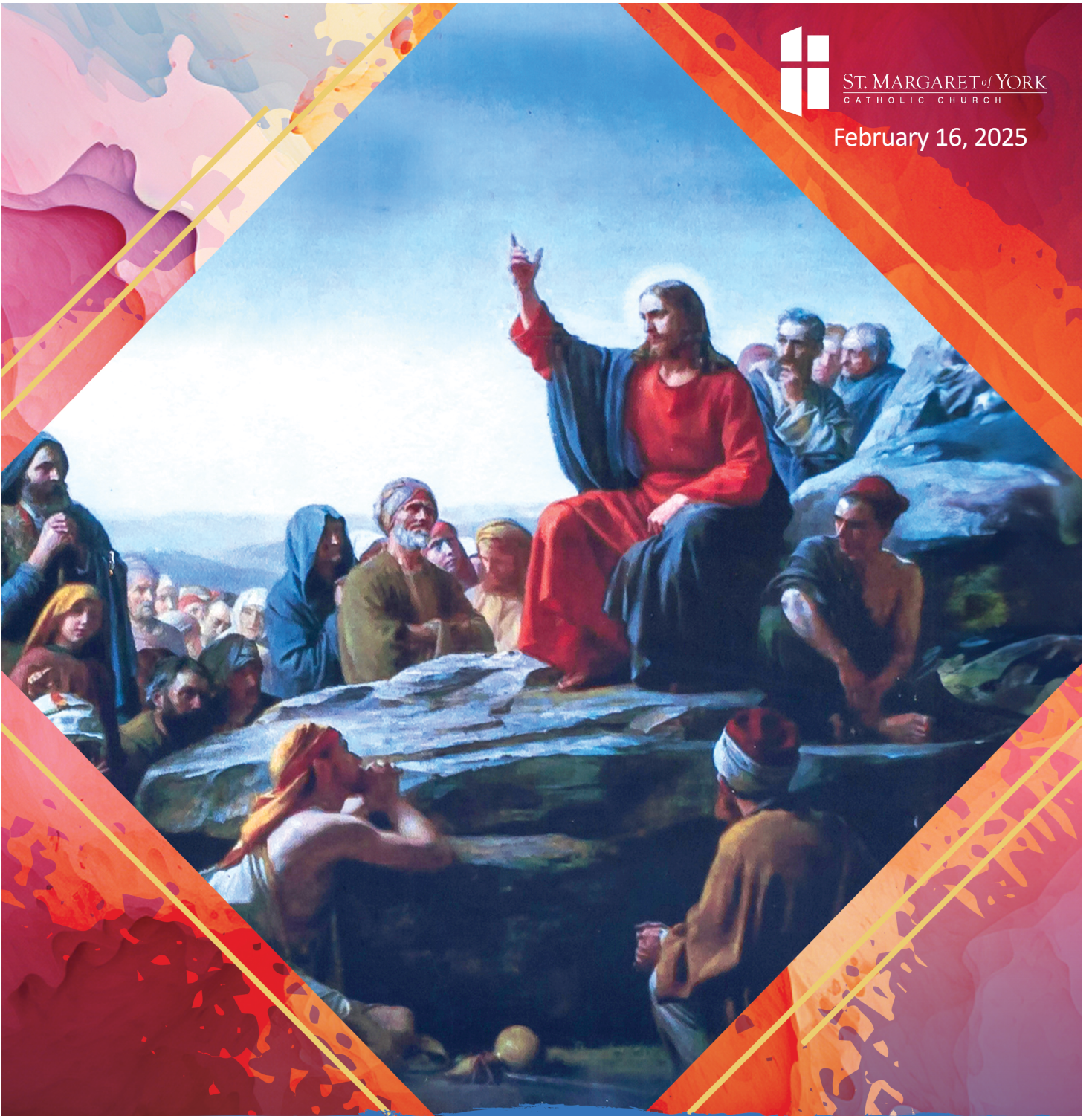

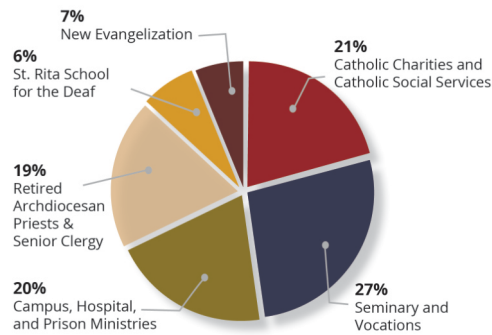

Celebrating Vocations During the Jubilee!

Pope Francis has opened the 2025 Jubilee Year under the theme "Pilgrims of Hope," emphasizing a renewed trust in God, the Church, and society.

In his Papal Bull, he called for a revival of faith, dignity, and respect for creation, highlighting the shared journey of believers as pilgrims seeking hope. This theme underscores the Jubilee as a time of spiritual renewal, fostering unity and encouragement in personal relationships, international affairs, and the broader mission of the Church.

As part of the celebration, Pope Francis has designated special jubilees throughout the year, each honoring different vocations, life stages, or themes. Upcoming Jubilees include those for Artists (Feb. 15-18) and Deacons (Feb 21-23). These events offer moments of prayer, reflection, and celebration, recognizing holiness in various aspects of life and encouraging the faithful to support one another in their spiritual journeys.

Sunday Reflection

The Sixth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Jeremiah 17:5-8; 1 Corinthians 15:12, 16-20; Luke 6:17, 20-26

The Beatitudes are one of the most famous passages in the Gospels. However, we may have become most familiar with the version in the Gospel of St. Matthew. This weekend we have the Beatitudes from the Gospel of St. Luke. They are slightly different. This brings up a legitimate question: Why? Perhaps a more fundamental question would be: Why do we have four Gospels in the first place? Are they not all proclaiming the story of Jesus? Why four instead of just one?

Good question! Now for an attempt at an answer: The life and ministry of Jesus is so extraordinary, massive, and sacred that to try and encapsulate it all in just one Gospel would be impossible. Also, the four Gospel writers were attempting to answer the needs and questions of the various Christian communities in the early days of the Church. Finally, the Gospels were written under the inspiration of the Holy Spirit, and since these documents have continued to make a living and profound difference in the lives of so many people, generation after generation, it is clear that God knew what He was doing in giving us more than one way to look at the life of Jesus!

So now, let's look at one verse of this weekend's reading. "Blessed are you who are poor." We are all poor in the sight of God. We all need help. We all have parts of us that are lacking. We all need one another. We all need God to get through life. When we forget this and consider ourselves 'rich' in the sense that we have it all, that we need nothing or no one else, we are in trouble. It is when we are honest, humble, open and willing to receive God's gifts that we are really "blessed".

St. Luke makes it clear that Jesus wants to help us who are poor [meaning all of us], that He is ready, with open arms, to give us what we truly need, and that He does this with great love. This Gospel, then, consoles us with the fact that, poor as we are, God's rich blessings are constantly offered to us. Our task is to open our hearts, souls and lives to receive them!

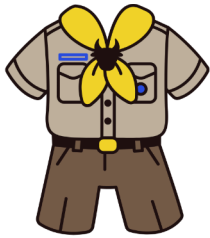

Consecrated to the Holy Eucharist

More than fifty parishioners gathered in the Day Chapel on Sunday, February 2, 2025 to consecrate themselves to the Holy Eucharist.

Consecration was the culmination of a profound journey that began in January. Groups and individuals read and reflected upon *33 Days to Eucharistic Glory*. Using the book as a guide, participants were able to strengthen their relationship with Christ and His real presence in the Eucharist.

As these individuals spoke the Prayer of Eucharistic Consecration, they said, "Teach my soul how to receive your Son in the Eucharist, and how to represent Him in this world." Fr. Stephen then offered a final blessing.



Beacons of Light Update

The **St. Margaret of York/St. Columban Pathways Team** continues to meet to discuss opportunities to share best practices in our Beacons of Light Family of Parishes. The committee developed a grid of ministries offered by both parishes and were pleasantly surprised to learn that between us we have 75 different ministries, 55 of which exist at both parishes. This gave us an opportunity to discern which groups could invite the other to their meetings and activities – strength in numbers. Our goal is successful collaboration between ministry groups where it makes sense, such as with our Knights of Columbus Assembly, Backpack Ministry, and Quilting Group.

Given the growth at both parishes and schools (currently at capacity), and our combined 4,000+ households, we will continue to discuss best ways to keep our parishes connected via the work of our ministries and lay leaders, recognizing that the concern over having fewer priests in the future is very much a reality. We also intend to respect the differences and unique gifts each parish brings to the Family.

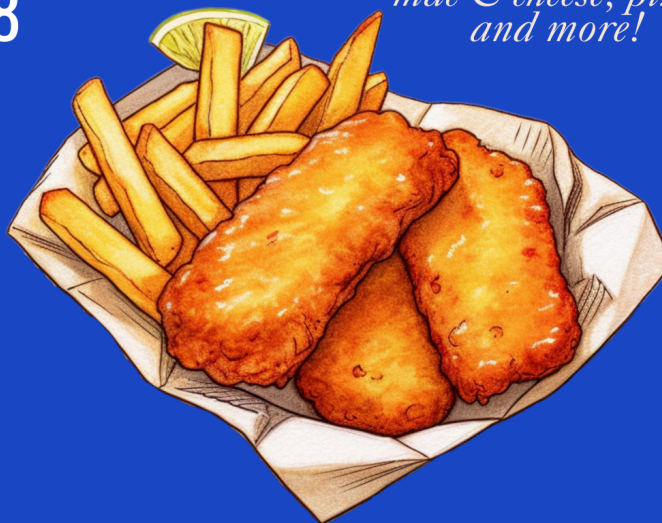
