# Sunday Reflection

## The First Sunday of Lent

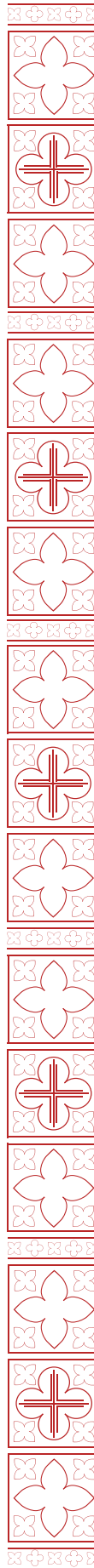
Deuteronomy 26:4-10; Romans 10:8-13; Luke 4:1-13

On Ash Wednesday we began our forty days of Lent. Our Gospel this weekend tells us that Jesus fasted for forty days in the desert. This connection reminds us how holy this season of Lent is, and how important it is for us to embrace its possibilities for growth and conversion.

It seems, however, to begin on a negative note: "Jesus was tempted." These three words might seem surprising to many believers. Some might think that the temptation scene in the Gospel between the devil and Jesus is just a myth...others might think that Jesus was never really tempted in the way we are, and therefore did not have to struggle with it the way we do. Both of these views are wrong. Remember that Jesus is both divine and human, and the reality of his tempting shows that He went through everything we experience [except sin] and suffered the way we do.

But He did not give in to the temptation. He shows us that it is possible to move from slavery to sin to the freedom of the children of God. This involves daily decisions that flow from our faith which enable us to confront temptations over and over [recall that Jesus was tempted three times, each time more strongly]. And this is not easy.

However, we not only have God to help us, but we also have one another. This weekend the Church celebrates the continuing Jubilee year by remembering the many VOLUNTEERS of our parish that make it possible to do the work of Jesus every day. As a result, we do much more than survive in life...we prevail! And we do so with the presence of God, the example of Jesus, the gift of the Holy Spirit, and the hours and hours of work that our volunteers put in so that every member of our parish community can be strong, loving and wise as people of HOPE, the watchword of this Jubilee Year!



## Domestic Church Corner

### Sacrament of Holy Matrimony

#### Description of the Sacrament

"Oh God, in creating the human race, you willed that husband and wife should be one. We ask you to join in a bond of inseparable love your servants who are to be united in the covenant of marriage."

This is from the opening prayer for a Catholic wedding. It reminds us of the importance of God's plan for people, of the unity of husband and wife, and of the beauty of love, which gives our lives meaning.

The catechism tells us that "The matrimonial covenant, by which a man and a woman establish between themselves a partnership of the whole of life, is by its nature ordered toward the good of the spouses and the procreation and education of offspring; this covenant between baptized persons has been raised by Christ the Lord to the dignity of a sacrament." "God himself is the author of marriage. The vocation to marriage is written in the very nature of man and woman as they came from the hand of the Creator."

The Sacrament of Holy Matrimony requires the following. (Note that marriages outside these requirements are not considered as the Sacrament of Holy Matrimony by the Church):

- The couple marrying must be one male and one female
- The man and woman must be baptized Christians
- The couple must be free of any impediment that would prevent marriage
- The couple must give their consent to be married by an act of their will
- They must be married according to the laws of the Church
- If one of them is not a baptized Christian, the Church celebrates a natural, covenantal bond, which has the force of a sacramental marriage

#### The Effects of the Sacrament of Holy Matrimony

The primary effect of the Sacrament of Matrimony is the indissoluble bond it creates between husband and wife.

The grace that arises from this bond, perfects the love of husband and wife so that it ever more images the love of Christ for His Church. It binds the couple together in fidelity to God and to one another and helps them welcome and care for children.

#### How Does the Sacrament Happen?

Unlike any of the other Sacraments, the couples administer the Sacrament to one another. They declare their consent to marry and make vows. A priest or deacon must witness the vows on behalf of the Church and bless the marriage. The couple gives consent to the marriage before the priest or deacon, the congregation, and God. The **form** of the Sacrament is the consent of the couple and the vows made. The **matter** of the Sacrament is the couple themselves, one man and one woman who are free to contract the marital union.

If a couple was married outside the Church, say on a beach or at a wedding venue, without an annulment, or one was divorced civilly, that marriage is considered a civil marriage and not a sacramental marriage.

If you find yourself in one of the above-mentioned situations and desire to receive the graces of the Sacrament of Holy Matrimony for your marriage, it is possible to do that, even after years of being married. You can learn more about a marriage convalidation by contacting one of our priests.

# Beyond Our Parish Doors

## Friends of Jesus

Friends of Jesus is a group for adults with developmental disabilities (18 years of age or older). This group's focus is primarily for support, prayer and socializing.
